## What's Behind the Steps?

## Wake Up. Suit up. Grow up. Show up.

"Your job now is to be at the place where you may be of maximum helpfulness to others, so never hesitate to go anywhere if you can be helpful." [Alcoholics Anonymous (the Big Book), "Working With Others," p.102.]

Black out. Wake up. Freak out. Make a phone call.

When I called the helpline, a guy told me where the meeting was and I went. I have not had a drink (or a drug) since. I did not know, at the time, that the person who answered the call was staying sober by answering the call. That, as selfish as this may sound, the purpose of 12th Step is as much to stay sober as it is to help someone get sober. He (ultimately HP) saved my life. But possibly this had also saved his.

There is an old story about before Bill met Dr. Bob, he attempted to help many alcoholics. Exasperated at his seeming failure, he complained to his wife that not one of the men he reached out to had stayed sober. She reportedly replied, "I know one man who has stayed sober."

I went to meetings. I got a sponsor. I worked (albeit *slowly*) the steps. I made coffee, I was a group treasurer, secretary, coffee maker, meeting chair . . . I did service.

Eventually, I discovered that the most meaningful type of service for me was reaching out to other struggling alcoholics. Giving back,

## A Group of Principles

The *Twelve and Twelve* describes AA's Twelve Steps as "a group of principles, spiritual in nature, which, if practiced as a way of life can expel the obsession to drink and enable the sufferer to become happily and usefully whole" ("Foreward," pg.15). So, in the most basic sense, behind the steps are the spiritual principles of Alcoholics Anonymous.

These spiritual principles such as honesty, acceptance, faith, hope, and love are certainly not unique to AA. They have been guiding forces throughout the history of humankind. The steps are simply a way for us to put these principles into action in our lives or in "all our affairs." Without action, these principles are merely words or concepts. They do not become spiritual until they are practiced.

Certain steps emphasize certain principles more than others. For example, acceptance is a big part of Step 1; willingness and faith for 2 and 3; self-examination and courage for steps 4 and 5. However, the principles of the program are not independent of one another. As we learn and grow, we realize that they are all related; even intertwined. The principles (and the steps) depend upon each other. After all, can we have genuine humility without honesty? Can we have faith without gratitude? Trust without integrity?

These spiritual principles represent perfect ideals, which we as humans will never attain. The program of Alcoholic's Anonymous

face to face or phone to phone, what was freely given is the essence of Step 12.

Little things like staying for the "meeting after the meeting" or big things like going out on a 12 Step call gave me hope and made me realize the power of, and sometimes the fragility of, sobriety. I learned that it is an honor and a privilege to work with others, formally as a sponsor, or informally at coffee after the meeting. Listening to myself repeat the words that I have heard, and maybe need to hear in that moment, never fails to fill me with gratitude. It's what I am supposed to do, and I have learned that when I do what I am supposed to do, I am at peace.

**Literature and Merchandise**: At present there are no soft covered copies of the 24 Hour a Day book. They will be in stock next month.


Where and When: A new one has been published and is back to the original format. B commented on the change saying he liked it better as it was less confusing.

understands this. In more practical terms the principles represent goals for which to strive through continued action. The steps provide instructions on what to do when we fall short, and we will. All the promises of the program really do come true when we practice these principles, as learned through the steps, in "all our affairs."

#### **Everyone Has One**

## First Impressions and Defects of Character

In my work life, I have always thought that I was very good with people. This belief has been validated by coworkers and bosses. Not so much in my personal life. Since I have been in the program, I am trying to suspend judgment of others and to be genuine with those with whom I share this disease regardless of first impressions. I will always be a work in progress, though through prayer, meditation, and work with my sponsor, I can see progress.

So, what is happening when I see someone at a meeting and have an immediate and negative reaction? Why do I not like this person on sight?

Sometimes I justify it based on something about the person. Recently, I heard another alcoholic say that she did not like some people because of the way she felt when around them. Wow! Can my feelings about another person come from some ancient feelings of mine generated by defects of character and have nothing to do with the other person? If this is true and I now think it is, some new work is cut out for me. I thank God and my fellow alcoholic.




