# "Humbly Asked... The Key to Spiritual Evolution"

How ironic that the only thing that can save me from a certain path of moral degradation, physical decay, and a long unpleasant death is a new lifestyle based on spiritual growth. Also paradoxical is the fact that the sure-fire proven way to attain this way of living is to embrace the willingness to develop some humility and proceed with the steps.

Steps 1 and 2 tell me that I have a seemingly

hopeless problem (something I knew anyway, but was too prideful and scared to accept). I realized that you folks actually looked comfortable, and had an answer, of sorts, for the insanity of active alcoholism. The change really started in step 3 where I was willing to submit my will and

my life over to a Power greater than me. The destruction of my prideful arrogance allows me to humbly ask for, and accept, your help and God's help.

The middle six steps are where I get another shot at being right-sized. In steps 4 and 5 there is "a clear recognition of what and who we really are, followed by a sincere attempt to become what we could be" (the definition of humility from the 12 & 12). Steps 6 and 7 is

where I submit myself to my Creator once again. By this time the process of inventory has my pride and arrogance reduced enough to ask God, and the people around me, for help. By humbly asking for help, for direction, I have begun the slow mortification of my character defects, while I wait for God to remove them or put them to good use.

In the 3rd step prayer I ask to "relieve me of

the bondage of self." I wish to be free of the alcoholic self-absorption that cuts me off from God and my brothers and sisters. Since steps 6 and 7 are a lifetime practice, I can submit anything to God for Him to sort out and "to remove every single defect of character which stands in the way of my usefulness to

You and my fellows."

I thank God that this beautiful path of spiritual growth is available to me and you; we only had to travel down to the gates of hell to earn our seats in the rooms of Alcoholics Anonymous. The key seems to be that I humbly ask God to guide me daily, asking that I be useful to Him and my fellows. Personally, I can't wait to see who I become when I grow up!

Humility is said to be a necessity of sobriety. In fact, Step 1 in the 12 & 12 tells me that "until I so humble myself, my sobriety – if any – will be precarious (page 21). Also, regarding alcohol,

"self-confidence was no good whatever, in fact, it is a total liability" (page 22).

I know for myself, I didn't even know what the word humility meant when I came into the program. But through the steps, and

listening to those who have been through the steps before me, I've learned that humility consists of learning what my character defects are, and finding balance within me. I am no longer the best or the worst. I am, as I was told early on, "just another Bozo on the bus... just part of the herd... just another alcoholic among many." I am no longer terminally unique, and I have hope.

> So, when I humbly ask my higher power each morning for guidance, and for how I can become more useful inside and outside these rooms, my focus automatically focuses outward toward others. An amazing thing happens when I become willing to

freely give back what was given to me. This is when I become humble. This is when I become equal to others. This is when I finally belong someplace.




