In and Out of Willfulness

The idea that I am in control of anything (other than my attitudes and resulting actions) is laughable at best, and often a pitiful piece of wishful thinking! I am powerless over alcohol, drugs, people, and almost everything on this planet. It kind of makes me feel small at first, but then I get the idea that the illusion of control is really a futile notion. The pursuit of the illusion of control has been a driving factor in my alcoholism, and can easily cause great discomfort in recovery.

I think all of us were required early in our recovery to make lists of things we can and cannot control. It's easy to see that the list of things I can't control is literally endless. We alcoholics are not the only people who want to feel the imaginary feeling of stability by micromanaging our environment. Like all humans, we want to feel safe and secure. We would like to think that we have the final say in every part of our destiny. We found that it just isn't so.

The part of me that craves control is my willful childish ego. Perhaps I am advanced enough to actually trust God with the Middle East or perhaps the weather, but can I trust Him with my future and my well-being? Only as long as things are going my way. Like any spoiled brat would do, I tend to willfully manipulate reality to get my own way. As the late great Sandy B. used to put it "the only pain you will have in recovery is not getting your

own way." Changing *my way* is acceptance of life on life's terms. This creates harmony and peace.

I recently lost a friend when a delivery truck turned in front of his motorcycle. This sober young man was doing everything right, was on a spiritual path, and had everything going for him. This I just could NOT accept! I argued fervently with God, and got no satisfaction. I finally have come to the (obvious) conclusion that I am powerless over life and death, and that the "why" question was well above my pay grade. I can accept what happened and honor that friend in every way possible, or I can have an irascible pessimistic attitude and dishonor his memory. My willfulness, as usual, was simply a waste of time and energy.

I am happy to report that the length of time I spend in willful defiance has gotten much shorter through the years, and that I do indeed realize that the pain of "not getting my own way" is a self-inflicted wound. The answer was on page 86 of the Big Book the whole time: ".... we ask God for inspiration, and intuitive thought or decision. We relax and take it easy. We don't struggle." My wish is that we all remember that the struggle, and the pain, is optional!


