Portable Powerlessness

It was hard enough to get sober, much less to develop a disciplined routine of daily action. To this day, anything that disrupts my typical regimen can throw me off and cause the need to re-balance my day. So how can I remain comfortably sober and sane, and yet NOT be so rigid in my daily life? Perhaps my favorite single sentence from the A.A. Big Book is from page 77: "Our real purpose is to fit ourselves to be of maximum service to God and the people about us." If I can't take my program wherever I go, then it's useless to me and especially to God and my fellows.

If the first three steps are working in my life then I know for certain that I am the problem and the answer is to trust God, clean house, and help others. Service will keep me sober like nothing else, and having a "portable program" is the way to thinking and acting in the spirit of service. If I can view the world with eyes of compassion then perhaps I can be "happily and usefully whole" as promised in the 12&12. To the degree that I become relieved of "the bondage of self" the more peace and comfort I have in my life. I've had a number of old-timers remind me that I might just be the only example of recovery a person will see, and that I should "practice these principles in all my affairs."

The most useful and fun part of having an enthusiastic portable program is to visit other areas of this country, and even other parts of the world. Apparently my fear of people is fairly common and the *last* thing I want to do on vacation is meet new people, but forcing myself

out of the comfort zone has often saved me. Every time I get to an out-of-town meeting I become a brother among that particular family and I feel a closeness to the locals. Also, without exception, I learn about the local area and resources available. If I have been smart and pre-planned my meetings for that area I find that I'm much more comfortable. With this, I no longer feel like a stranger in a strange land where I might just as likely isolate and miss all the good stuff! This also worked on one trip to the Yucatan in Mexico where the entire meeting was in Spanish, but exactly the same as any of ours. Although my Spanish is poor, my brothers and sisters in Cancun made me feel like family. Same thing happened in Banff, Alberta, on a ski vacation - fortunately I speak Canadian.

So it turns out that everything I need to take my sobriety *on the road* is always with me. My God is always with me, so I can pray and meditate as often as I like. My phone provides me with literature and contact with fellow alcoholics such as my sponsor, my peers, and newcomers. I also have unlimited access to meeting locations wherever I go, so there is no excuse for isolation while traveling. I often travel with copies of speaker CDs to leave at out-of-town meetings; a fun and anonymous way of quiet and humble service. Always a fun adventure to see how our brothers and sisters out there enjoy sobriety!

Remember the mindfulness meditation: "Wherever you go, there you are." Perhaps we can be useful after all...




