50 Shades of Willingness

At the end of the day, in the quiet that occurs between me and my Creator, there is an undeniable truth to how I handled the details of this day. Was I honest in my dealings with other people (or even myself) all day? Did I maintain an open heart and a quiet mind such that I could be of service? Did I have a mindset of charity, love and compassion? Did I look for opportunities to "get out of self", to be useful (and thereby not suffer from chronic self-absorption)? We ALL know that these things are the "right" things to strive for, and we all know that these are the essential success tools of emotional sobriety!

I guess the question would be—just how willing am I to follow such a righteous pursuit? If you asked me I would probably claim to be unconditionally willing. Pride still wants me to look good in your eyes (and mine). Turns out that I am absolutely no different than any other recovering alcoholic, and that my degree of willingness varies with my human condition—whether I am fatigued, perhaps have low blood sugar, recently upset, maybe a bit of self-pity. All of these things change my perception of reality, and therefore, my outlook on life and other people. How embarrassing to find out that a former "tough guy" is actually frail.

The solution, at least for me, is to accept myself as I am with the commitment to do my dead-level best every day. I used to think that I had excellent willpower and ironclad discipline. My lack of consistency in so many recovery areas has taught me that willingness, discipline, service, compassion and love require constant attention. Practice, practice, practice! Perhaps it does me most good to aim at, and practice, these principles with the full knowledge that I will likely fall short of the mark. Over time there has been a noticeable change: that my prayers for willingness have been met by opportunities for action, and growth.

This step, for me, was one that was most difficult to understand. The big book doesn't give much direction with it. And the 12/12 states that "this is the step that separate the men from the boys". Being a woman, I got the concept - but again there wasn't much direction with it.

Someone in my homegroup, who I respect so much likes to rephrase this sentence to "this step separates the **WILLING**". Now that is getting my attention. Then my sponsor family read the book "Drop the Rock", for me that is where the clear directions came. The analogy of my character defect being like heavy rocks chained around my neck like a useless, ugly necklace. Swimming toward the boat of Serenity and not able to make it unless I became WILLING to let go of the rocks. Once I became willing, taking them off was really a simple task. KEEPING them off is another story, but it is the same process as staying sober ... I must MAKE THE DECISION EVERY DAY to not take the drink, to work on my recovery as if my life depends on it, and to all myself to be free of those defects of character that keep me from the sunlight.
