We come into the rooms of AA in a tattered grave state. I was hopelessly ashamed, a broken human of seemingly no value. The most amazing thing happened as I discovered that I was now part of a brotherhood of damaged souls- that all of you had felt the same abject desperation, shame, guilt, and hopelessness that I felt. Perhaps I had found an unexpected refuge from the hellish nightmare of alcoholism! I was willing to try anything although I suspected that I was beyond hope -mentally, physically, and spiritually.

The life stories from other people coupled with the Big Book and 12 & 12 started to convince me that I was possibly just a sick person instead of a permanently deranged moral leper. The idea that my problem was the misuse of the instincts made sense to me and that the point of our spiritual program was to re-align myself to that moral compass we had as children. I soon had the belief that this would work for me as well (with the good guidance of a loving but assertive sponsor). Soon I had faith that God had



somehow plucked me out of that horrifying and hopeless morass - that I might become a useful human being!

I believe it was (and is) the middle six steps that reacquaint me with my own humanity. The 4th and 5th steps gave me a clear idea of who I was, and who I was not. In 6 and 7 (with an accurate vision of who I was meant to be) I am able to submit my body, mind, and soul to my Creator. In 8 and 9 I get to face the people I hurt and make restitution. The amount of forgiveness afforded me during the ninth step amends reassured me that all people are basically good. Realizing that we are all human and that we will "fall short" every day certainly has a humbling effect.

The care and compassion involved in service work and sponsorship has had the best effect of allwe are all exactly the same, and we are on a beautifully imperfect but exciting journey. Clearly, I can choose fear or love to travel with.... what shall it be? A meditation book this morning had this: "Choosing love means I accept and embrace my humanity and that of others." ~ Anonymous

"Each group has but one primary purpose - to carry the message to the alcoholic who still suffers."

Thank GOD for this tradition! Although it is contradictory for a group of people who are self-centered to the extreme, I think. And I see people in the rooms that never seem to get the full benefit of this program, and many of them have never given freely of themselves to carrying THE message to the alcoholic who is still suffering, at least in my opinion.

At about 6 months sober I hit a wall with my recovery. It was exhausting me, and quite frankly I just didn't see the point. I was still going to meetings, I was still working with my sponsor and kind of working the steps. I had a home group and was doing service work there, but my recovery was becoming stale - and an effort I was getting tired of. Then I started going to one meeting a week at a treatment facility. I didn't understand the protocol of becoming part of the Treatment Committee. I had a friend that was there, and I went because I could see her. I thought I could help her by my "presence". But something unexpected happened. I saw people that reminded me how far I had come. All of a sudden I no longer I didn't take my sobriety for granted, I SAW THE VALUE OF MY EFFORT.

In the 3rd addition of the Big Book in a story called "The Professor and the Paradox", the alcoholic writes of the four paradoxes of AA: "We AAs surrender to win; we give away to keep; we suffer to get well, and we die to live". To me the best way I have given of my time is to go eye to eye, nose to nose with the people that remind me what my disease looks like. It has made me more compassionate and tolerant in meetings and in my life outside of meetings.






Why must I share my moral inventory with another human being? I certainly thought it was a little extreme, and very intimidating. It had been a very long time since I was honest - let alone "completely honest". But by the time I arrived to the step, I had a trusting relationship with my sponsor. She promised me that it would be okay.

It was fear that was the reason that I didn't want to do this step - plain and simple. I was afraid that if I told the secrets I've held for so long that my sponsor would ask me to leave and never return. And I believed at the time that I deserved that. But trust is a two-way street. I had to trust her, as she trusted me. Trust. Honesty. These were things that hadn't been part of my life for a long time. I prayed for the willingness to be willing.

So one afternoon we sat down in the safety of her living room and I trusted this Higher Power I had been working on believing in that this was in fact the next right thing to do. And after what seemed like a very long time it was over! And my sponsor had not asked me to leave - actually she shared some of her dark times with me, and would nod and say "Me, too". So I think of this step as the "Me, too" step. For me, not only was it amazing to have the burden of these secrets out, but more importantly it was a bonding experience between me and my sponsor.

It was maybe a year later that I realized the bigger impact of being willing to do a 4th and 5th step - the part of the promises that states "No matter how far down the scale we have gone, we will see how our experience can benefit others" started to work in my life. For me at least, when I shared those secrets that kept me sick with my sponsor, and she didn't shun me, it gave me courage to be more open and honest with other women sick and suffering with this disease. They didn't shun me either. And so the "Me, too" step started the healing process for me, and perhaps helped others relate to my journey in recovery.



NORTH CENTRAL FLORIDA INTERGROUP 25 MARCH 2018

Meeting opened at 13:00 with the Serenity Prayer.

ATTENDANCE – GN (chair), SR (secretary), FS (office mgr), CH, DH, MP, BK, JS, JF, DL, JM, CH, AW, PM, PB (treasurer), TR, KM (steering committee).

MINUTES – The minutes from 2/25/18 were read and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT – PB presented the treasurer's report (page 8 of the POST); 501c3 has been filed; next will be quarterly filings. Motion to accept by DL; seconded JF; approved.

PHONE COMMITTEE – SR gave the report; the grid is currently completely filled; the phone committee is in the process of updating the 12 step call listing/phone numbers.

POST – FS presented the POST "getting better all the time".

LITERATURE/MERCHANDISE – FS stated that at present the Intergroup Office is fully stocked, sales continue to be at cost; KM asked about profits from sales. Currently, the office manager is in the process of monitoring costs (Where & When, POST, literature), and sales, and this will be completed over a six month period (through June). JF brought up the topic of non-conference approved items; AW asked if non-conference approved items had been cleared out. Currently, some of the non-conference approved items are T-shirts, mugs, medallions, and chips. The T-shirts will be washed and then a determination will be made about having a sale on them. Chips were previously 3/\$1.00; now 3/\$1.25.

WHERE & WHEN – FS introduced the new W&W with the pamphlet-type format; it is designed so that it should be better utilized and not just thrown out. The online PDF version still needs work. There will be updates with the next printing. 1000 were printed; 350 given to District. AW asked about charging for the W&W in the future; no plans at this time. JF asked about it being dated; stated that as this is the first printing, it shows good progress. Changes can be made from the website.

WEBSITE – (WM, webmaster, not in attendance.) FS stated that William updates all meeting changes on the website; he is working on getting those changes into the PDF format. Events and flyers can be put onto the website; submit to the webmaster in jpeg format or with a link. JF noted that the Beta test previously announced by WM was outstanding.

ACTIVITIES – Gratitude Dinner meeting on 4/9/18, 6pm at the Intergroup office (see announcements in POST); KH announced that FCYPAA has weekly Unity events; PM announced the next Founder's Day meeting on 4/3/18, 7pm at the Triangle Club.

OLD BUSINESS – JF asked about the status of the Intergroup office inventory; FS stated that they are working on getting everything into Quickbooks; PB stated that this process is taking time as it is not easy to do accurately with all of the interruptions at the IG office. In the future, the inventory will include the number of items on hand, number of sales, etc. The first Steering Committee meeting went well; secretary and chair were selected; currently looking at versions of the bylaws; the next Steering Committee meeting will be 4/22/18, 12:30pm at the Intergroup office; visitors are welcome.

NEW BUSINESS – JF asked if the Intergroup meeting minutes could be e-mailed ahead of the meeting; SR said that she would make every effort to do this, and asked that members please make sure that their e-mail addresses were correct on the sign-in sheet.

There being no further business, JF moved that the meeting be adjourned; DL seconded; passed; meeting adjourned at 1:35pm.

DCM—PC. Thank you to everyone who came to the pre-conference workshop. Area Assembly is this weekend. There will be workshops all day Saturday. Sunday morning is when we vote on area issues. There is a new-GSR orientation at 9:00 AM on Saturday. From 4:30 to 6:30 PM on Saturday we will be discussing the GSC agenda with our delegate. You have to be in your seat on Sunday morning at 9:00 AM to vote as a GSR. We will be discussing budgets at the next meeting.

Alt DCM—CM. I have been absent from district for the last two months. I want to make amends for missing out on district activities. Please let me know if I can correct any troubles this has caused. I will be rededicating myself to my position.

Accessibilities—PC. KK is still laid out. She is still doing her job over the phone. She is ready to help. Archives—MT We are focusing on Founder's Day. We are creating a tree disc that will recognize all of the groups. Founder's Day is June 9. We still need help with planning. We will be meeting next Tuesday at the Triangle Club at 6:30 PM. Corrections—JiW. New GSRs are welcome to our monthly meeting. We need help from both men and women to go into the facilities. We are continuing to discuss Bridging the Gap. We have a new member bringing meetings into the Alachua work release. CPC/ PI—DA. At our last meeting, we discussed conference agenda items related to our committee. We brought Bridging the Gap pamphlets for people to take back to their home groups and to corrections. I have cases of several different AA books if someone needs to take into a treatment meeting. I put together packets for people going into treatment centers. I would like to have one order a month for centers that need literature, so please coordinate with me. Website—JM. Meetings are now on the first Tuesday at 7:00 PM at the Starbucks on 16th and 13th. We are communicating more with Intergroup and discussing combining web sites.
