

My Best Thinking ...

The suggestion that the root of my drinking problem was a “thinking problem” was very offensive when I first heard it! How dare you! Sure, I come from a long line of drunks on both sides of the family, both Irish and German. Unfortunate genetics perhaps, but it was not a reflection on my intelligence. Later my step work proved to be enlightening- my poor choices had led to bad behavior and unsavory consequences, but on any given day I was doing the very best I could under the circumstances of that day.

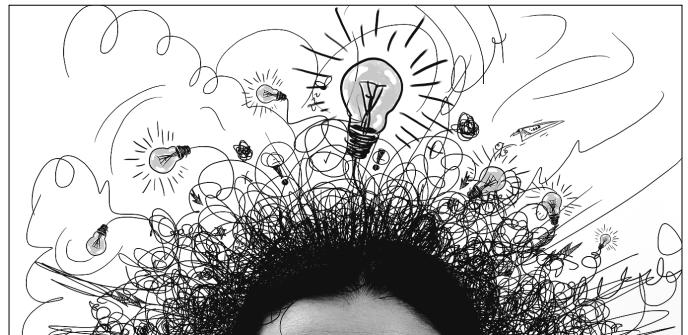
So, it turns out that the drinking (and all my other forms of inebriation) was the comfortable solution to that uncomfortable thinking problem. It was crystal clear to me as early as the tender age of 9 that I was thinking way too fast and too much! I also was uncomfortable with the quantity and intensity of my emotions, and therefore altogether uneasy and restless. Alcohol changed that! I had finally found the peace I had always wanted and needed!

My first sponsor had the nerve to say that my thinking (and decision making) was so bad that I probably should do the opposite of whatever good idea I came up with! Better yet, call first.

My step work revealed that I have made most major (and minor) decisions based almost entirely on emotion instead of logic, facts, or intellect. Therefore, I had approached life in a purely reactive and contentious way. Steps 6,7, and 10 allow me to switch to a more proactive and gentle way of looking for solutions. I can currently see very clearly whether I am reacting (out of emotions such as anger, greed, or jealousy) or calmly acting out of factual evidence- big difference.

My (best) thinking pre-sobriety actually DID get me here - a series of unfortunate misunderstandings and awkward consequences let me "hit bottom" where major lifestyle and thinking changes (or death) were inevitable. By the Grace of God, I just happened to end in AA where a family of spiritual brothers and sisters were able to "mentor" me into a whole new wonderful existence. I am forever grateful for the sober peace I had always wanted and needed!

Finally, a step that was EASY for me... at least by the time I reached it. The founding members knew what they were doing when they placed these steps in this order.

The lessons from the previous steps were sometimes baffling, often painful... but then I come to Step 12, and "get to" practice THESE principles in all my affairs and CARRY this message to the still sick and suffering alcoholics.

These principles – **Honesty** from Step 1. **Hope** from Step 2. **Faith**, Step 3. **Courage & Integrity** from Steps 4 and 5. **Willingness & Humility**, Steps 6 and 7. **Brother Love & Justice** from Steps 8 and 9. **Perseverance** from Step 10, **Spirituality** from Step 11, and finally **Service** with Step 12. This is a map to keep me in the middle of the road to happy destiny.

This is a strong contrast to the life I was living in active alcoholism.... Where the world revolved around my needs, my wants, and MY FEARS! These steps brought be me from a self-centered mess to a life with purpose, with (mostly) good orderly direction and with GOD as my center. I have learned how to conform to the world and I found the key to happiness lies in what I can offer rather than what I can receive. I have received not one – but numerous spiritual awakenings during my time in this fellowship.

I think it is fitting that this 12th Step is discussed during the 12th month – could during the spirit of Christmas. And through these 12 steps, I have found my Christmas spirit again. I wish I wrap these Steps up and give them to those I know who could benefit from them... but I know it doesn't work that way. So, I'll keep living by the principle of attraction vs. promotion. At least just for today.

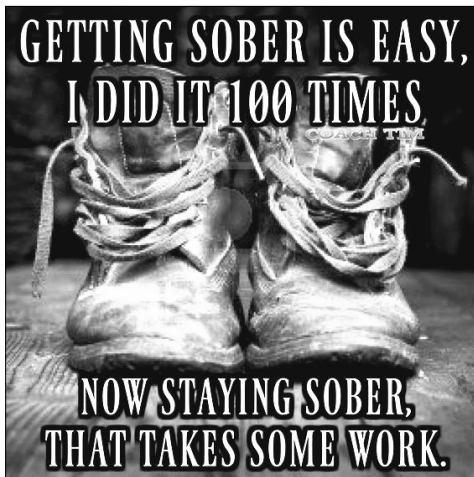

“Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.”

And finally, we of Alcoholics Anonymous believe that the principle of anonymity has an immense spiritual significance. It reminds us that we are to place principles before personalities; that we are actually to practice a genuine humility. This to the end that our great blessings may never spoil us; that we shall forever live in thankful contemplation of Him who presides over us all.

The following is a collection of ideas which com from Grapevine articles on the Twelfth Tradition:

Understanding the traditions is not something I do by myself, that is the gift of AA. I learn from those around me and those who have gone before me. This is a we program. Anonymity is truly the core of all AA teachings. This core of anonymity is actually the genuine humility mentioned above. How do I acquire this humility? As I work my program, I stay teachable, I work on unselfishness. I must learn to place the welfare of others before my own, without the reward of praise. And I need to be generous about giving others credit when credit is their due. In the anonymity of the fellowship, I am one among many, what I am outside the rooms is irrelevant.

Reading through these suggestions brought me back to the person who came into these rooms. A person who thought she had nothing to be humble about. But who, in fact, was scared to death you would discover the miserable mess I was inside. I remained prideful much longer than I care to admit. Life has a way of teaching me what I need to learn. I was blessed with wonderful sponsor who took great pleasure in poking holes in my “perfect exterior.” I am forever grateful to her. I am a bit more right sized these days.

The anonymity of the 12th Tradition is not so much for my protection, but for the protection, the survival of the program. No one person should represent AA, we are a fellowship of millions. When I present the program to someone, I am carrying the message, the suggestions of AA based upon the experience strength and hope of the group. It is important for me to keep this in mind. It is not about me, I am a grateful to be a sober servant.

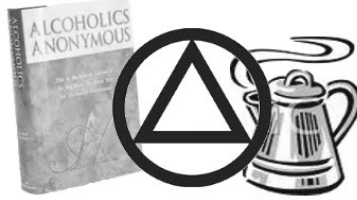

ATTENDANCE – GN (Chair), SR (Secretary), KK (Alt Secretary), PB (Treasurer), FS (Office Manager), JH (Activities), WM (Webmaster), PC (District 14 DCM), TR, BK, JVB, AT, JS, DL, TC, JM, JF, CH, MR, PM, ST (FCYPAA liaison), NI, DH, B, S, E, J.

MINUTES – September minutes on page 7 of the POST, read and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT – PB presented the report (page 8 of the POST), pointing out certain expenses (the annual insurance premium, payroll taxes reflecting refund by the IRS); Gratitude Dinner reserve which reflects a transfer to checking, is currently ~\$1600; Prudent Reserve for the office is listed separately to accurately reflect available funds in the checking account. Motion to accept, seconded, and passed.

PHONE COMMITTEE – SR (presented for SS) and noted that the phone grid is currently filled; SS is covering for DH while she is out. Workshop on 10/13/18 and SS recorded; CD will be available at orientation, The Phone Manual is currently nearing completion of update.

POST – JH presented noting page 10 ads; group contributions noted on page 11.

LITERATURE/MERCHANDISE/WHERE & WHEN – FS presented; new Where & When is available; one year medallions are on back order (Wendell's Medallions longtime provider). JM asked if we have "The God Word" pamphlet available; M noted that it had been discussed at GSO and some changes approved in April, 2018 but is not yet published. DL noted that she has a roll of raffle tickets to donate to the office.

WEBSITE – WM presented; new meetings and events posted on the website.

ACTIVITIES – JH distributed flyers to advertise the e-mail address for activities submissions; WM commented on the centralized e-mail and the ease for submissions.

DCM REPORT – PC presented; elections last month and most positions filled; effective January 1, 2019, CM will be DCM, DA is Alt DCM, treasurer is CP; secretary/alt secretary needed; literature, website and CPCPI chairs needed. District meets on the 2nd Wednesday, 6pm at Westminster Presbyterian.

OLD BUSINESS – Gratitude Dinner coming up, planning meeting on 10/29/18 at 6pm, KM's house and then 11/5/18; help always needed on the committees; PM noted that church would open at noon for decorating; nine tickets available at the IG office (300+ sold); B brought aluminum foil sheet pans if needed to make covered dishes.

KK noted that IG needs an alternate treasurer. ♦ FM brought up MRs prior request to look into have a "Welcome" chip for visitors to the area; the chips are 65 cents each and minimum order is 300 chips. ♦ WM reintroduced the exclusion of the Freethinkers meeting from the W&W; not associated with AA Agnostica; requested that it be revisited; discussion by NI and others who attend Freethinkers about alternate 12 steps and 3rd tradition, and they consider themselves an AA Group (registered with GSO), and request that decision to exclude be revisited. GN reviewed process of decision-making including discussion with GSO and previous delegates/trustees; decision centered on use of alternate versions of the steps; extensive discussion and vote (8/3 to remove); if an intergroup rep made a motion to reconsider then it could be reopened; decision did not center on inclusion of atheists and agnostics. There was extensive discussion. It was proposed/agreed that the issue be taken back to the group for further discussion about their structure/use of the steps/traditions, and the issue will be discussed at the next Intergroup meeting. ♦ GN updated on the status of the Intergroup Bylaws; last changes were mostly grammatical; a motion was made/passed to accept the updated Bylaws (a copy will be mailed to groups with minutes as well as being posted on the website).

NEW BUSINESS – S distributed a flyer about groups affected by Hurricane Michael needing literature, books, and grapevines; donations can be made to cover the cost of literature or the literature itself can be donated; donations can be dropped off at the Triangle Club, the Intergroup Office, or the Gratitude Dinner; the deadline for donations will be 11/9/18 at the Gratitude Dinner. ♦ GN reminded everyone that the Alkathon is approaching and asked if any groups have already made commitments to chair meetings (he took names of groups that volunteered); the time slots will be drawn next month; meetings will run 24 hours a day starting at 12n on 12/31/18 and running until 12n on 1/1/19.
