Alcoholism led me down a dark and depressing road, to the point that I was sure that there could not possibly be a God who could snatch me back from that grizzly despair. Certainly, a Creator that would allow that kind of suffering had completely abandoned His creation! It was me against the cruel world, and that familiar voice of impending doom was a constant nagging demon- one of many. My childhood included a faith in God but He was nowhere to be seen. When I finally got to recovery I was asked about my relationship with my Higher Power and I was asked "who moved?" . The gracious and patient people around me suggested that God was with me the whole time and that maybe I survived those many years of savage suffering so that I may be of service somehow. Sounded like impossibly twisted thinking to me...

It has been said that God works in mysterious ways. I believe that those of us who have been on this spiritual path for awhile can surely attest to this. My former mediocre life had to crash and burn for me to be teachable, and to reach and receive the blessings of recovery. This journey has been slow and painful, but despite my persistent impatience it has been a wonderful collection of priceless gifts. The 12 & 12 says the pain is the touchstone of all spiritual progress. How true! How skillfully God times those lessons.... On hindsight I can see that many or my "lessons" have been missed, ignored, or altogether mishandled. It helps me to accept the fact that I will indeed fall short in my lessons every day, and the awareness gives me a sharper focus. It certainly makes sense that God would put our best resources right in front of us!

The key to life, it has been said, is simply to pay attention (all else will follow). I noticed that the people who had faith and trust in their Higher Power stand out in AA. They are at peace with themselves and their surroundings, they seem to fit in wherever they go, and they have the ability to be useful in service to others They are happy, content, and peacefully satisfied with life. It has been my experience that if I simply pay attention that God provides every single thing I need, when I need it. This requires complete trust and, most importantly, absolute surrender to His will (and His grace). Not an easy task for a willful person like me. Progress began for me the moment I could finally admit that all "God arguments" were permanently "above my pay grade". My ability to become "attuned" to my Creator is directly proportional to how much I can quiet my mind (and will) and open my heart. I suspect that this will take a lifetime (I'm grateful that I still have one). Perhaps prayer and meditation practices were incorporated into our program for this purpose.

I have been reminded a number of times that "patience is its own reward". I'm starting to see the wisdom in that! Most of my current challenges have come from not paying attention, and also from "outrunning" God. I am learning to be still and pay attention: Perhaps, I can grow spiritually as God directs my path. It still comes down to surrendering my will again and again.... steps 3, 7, and 11 again and again. We will all spiritually evolve, all in God's time.

The principle is Honesty. I didn't know much about what that meant when I arrived. They said is wasn't a casual type, either - it was RIGOROUSLY HONESTY. The type with no loop holes, no "little", or "white" options. I had to take a good hard look at where my life choices and behaviors had lead me. I came to truly believe in my heart and soul that I was, infact, powerless over alcohol, and my life was not only unmanageable, it was UNBEARABLE. In this place of incomprehensible demoralization I found the gift of desperation where I became willing to try a different way of living. I had nothing to lose of any value. And what I have gained, starting that day, is beyond words. It started with becoming honest with myself ...



ATTENDANCE – GN (Chair), BC (Alt Chair), SR (Secretary), KK (Alt Secretary), PB (Treasurer), FS (Office Mgr), WM (Webmaster), DO (POST), PC (District 14 DCM), C (Trustee), TR, MP, BK, JVB, AT, J S, DL, TC, JM, JF, CH, MR, PM, ST, NI, JH, MS.

MINUTES – October minutes on Page 7 of the POST, read and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT – PB presented the report (page 10 of the POST), read and approved. PB noted that the next POST would include a detailed breakdown of the status of accounts following the Gratitude Dinner; \$1500 advance was refunded to the Intergroup checking account; net profit was \$4732; consideration to increase the prudent reserve; to be discussed further next month when breakdown is available. **PHONE COMMITTEE** – SR (for SS) currently only vacancy on the grid is Monday, 7am; the new phone

manuals are in and can be picked up at the IG office.

POST – DO reminded everyone of the deadline of the 12th for the submissions to the POST; this will be especially critical this month due the Christmas holiday (and will be in February due to a short month); she also requests that birthday submissions include first name and last initial.

LITERATURE/MERCHANDISE/WHERE & WHEN – FS noted that the IG office is fully stocked, recently sold a case of hard cover Big Books; the holiday Grapevine is in; he and WM are working on getting prices on the website. 400 new W/W (November) are in, 35 cents each.

WEBSITE – WM handed out proposed guidelines for listing events (see new business); he has now put links in the online W/W meeting schedule for maps to meeting addresses.

ACTIVITIES – Annual Alkathon (see new business) at the Triangle Club; see back page of the POST.

DCM REPORT – PC presented (page 9 of the POST); the secretary for District 14 has been filled; still needed are alternate secretary, alternate treasurer, CPCPI, Grapevine, and Literature chairs.

OLD BUSINESS – 1) FS – Hurricane Michael donations are now closed; over 135 books have already been delivered, and there are more pending delivery along with other literature and supplies. 2) PB put forth the nomination of MR for Alternate Treasurer; MR introduced himself and reviewed his qualifications (sobriety date 4/20/98, extensive service experience); the motion was made and passed to accept MR as Alt Treasurer. 3) NI from Freethinkers opened the discussion regarding resubmitting their meeting into the W/W (previous vote 8/3 to disallow); she requested that WM speak for the group. WM presented an extensive argument as to why they should be allowed including the argument that they do not have an outside affiliation and that their literature embodies the principles of recovery; MS also provided a handout with history felt to support their group. A motion was made and seconded to allow Freethinkers to be included in the W/W; after further discussion, a vote was taken (vote was 8/8 and the previous vote to disallow Freethinkers into the W/W stands due to their alteration of the wording of the Twelve Steps).

NEW BUSINESS – 1) WM gave a handout of proposed guidelines for including activities on the website and include the guidelines as an appendix to the Bylaws; after discussion, it was decided that groups take the handout back to their groups for review and discussion at the next meeting. 2) The Alkathon will be from noon on 12/31/18 until 12 noon on 1/1/19; the names of groups who had volunteered to host a meeting were submitted and drawn for the vacancies. 3) JF advised that his term as Trustee for Intergroup will be up at the end of the year; C will become 1 yr Trustee, PB will become 2 yr Trustee, and a 3yr Trustee is needed.


