

Finding Hope

Most of us were beyond hope or anything else by the time we (miraculously) found Alcoholics Anonymous. I was certainly one of those people. I was tired, bitter, demoralized, and fed up with life itself. Other than being 40 pounds underweight and a weird hue of ashen gray, I thought I had hidden my alcoholism fairly well. I could not imagine that anyone could understand what I was going through, and certainly not comprehend the darkness in my soul! I was broken.

A series of unusual "circumstances" landed me in a treatment center where, despite my defiance and crazy antics, I found that there were indeed many other people with near-identical stories who felt the same way. Each AA meeting I went to give me morsels of hope. This was particularly reassuring, but also real scary- I had only known a life of sneaky and dishonest inebriation for many years- how was I to live in the "real" world? How could I learn not to slither through life? As I proceeded with the steps I found even more hope. Fully admitting powerlessness and the insanity of my disease somehow took that terrible burden of control off my shoulders. I was no longer in charge.

Steps three and seven allowed me to finally surrender. The battle was over. The war was finished. I had acquired a faith in a Power that would (as the Big Book says) relieve me of my problems. Working the 4th and 5th steps showed me that my psyche and soul, my personality, was still very much intact. I began to have faith (and trust) that God could remove the garbage that had overshadowed my relationship to Him and my fellows. Facing life on life's terms seems like a possibility. I was reborn.

The 10th, 11th, and 12th steps not only enhance my faith and trust in my Higher Power, but also allow me to express gratitude in the form of Love and Service. This is particularly important to me because I had lost my sense of purpose and meaning for many, many years. Since God is in charge I often do not know what the "next right thing" is until it presents itself. I have a general idea of where I need to be from hour to hour, but the "assignments" pop up and all I need to do is pay very careful attention and do the next right thing!

It's a very miraculous thing to experience such abject hopelessness and then evolve into a happy, useful, trustworthy, and content human being. I am forever indebted to God, my sponsor, the fellowship, and this divinely inspired program. I often ponder as to why I would be chosen to get such a big and rich life. 'Tis not mine to understand (way above my pay grade). I am thankful beyond words, especially considering that my life would have ended poorly many years ago! Perhaps that is why I've heard that our gratitude should be expressed in action: "pay it forward".

Tradition 2

The Steps are HOW IT WORKS.
The Traditions are WHY IT WORKS.

For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.

The Grapevine archive is filled with wonderful “stories” about the Second Tradition. And as I read them, I was reminded of my own naïve ideas about the structure of AA when I first got sober. I could not believe that it was so loosely organized with no one in charge. How did anything ever get done? Well, having served in leadership in many organizations, I would gladly give my expertise to the group. What I did not know or understand is Tradition Two. There is in fact an ultimate authority, a loving God or Good Orderly Direction or Group of Drunks or Higher Power or HP as He may express himself in our group conscience.

Thank God for the Group Conscience, no irony intended. It can be defined as the informed opinion of the majority of the membership. I am always amazed at the group conscience process in the meetings I attend. In the beginning there are often strong opposing ideas. The opinions may be expressed loudly and at length. In the end the group must come together. I have been in home groups where people left because they did not agree with the group conscience. That is certainly their right. Over time I have seen groups wax and wane in membership. The idea is that no alcoholic should feel compelled to drink over group disagreements. Unity is the first tradition. The person who leaves with a resentment must certainly look at his or her part in it as they go forward. Tradition Two guides to keep an open heart and mind as we trudge this road to happy destiny together.

We begin and end our meetings with prayer, a reminder of who is in charge. Each member does the same daily, turning our will over. Hopefully this means our leaders conduct themselves in a trustworthy manner. These leaders are not bosses. All positions of trust are rotated regularly. This helps to ensure that there is no permanent ruling clique. Often in fact, it is hard to find enough people to serve. In the spirit of Service, one of the foundations of AA, each of us should be willing to take a job in our home group to keep it running. Keeping a meeting running is the way we pass it on. I thank God for the meetings in which I first got sober. I want them available for the next newcomer. For truly, the newcomer is the most important person in the room.

Step 2

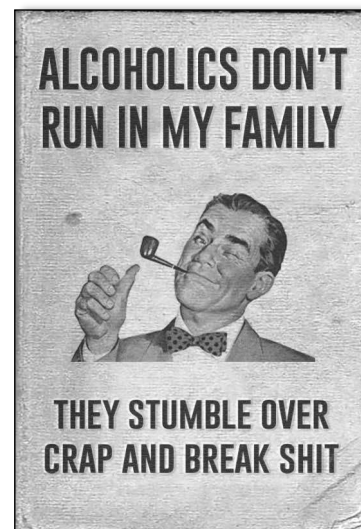
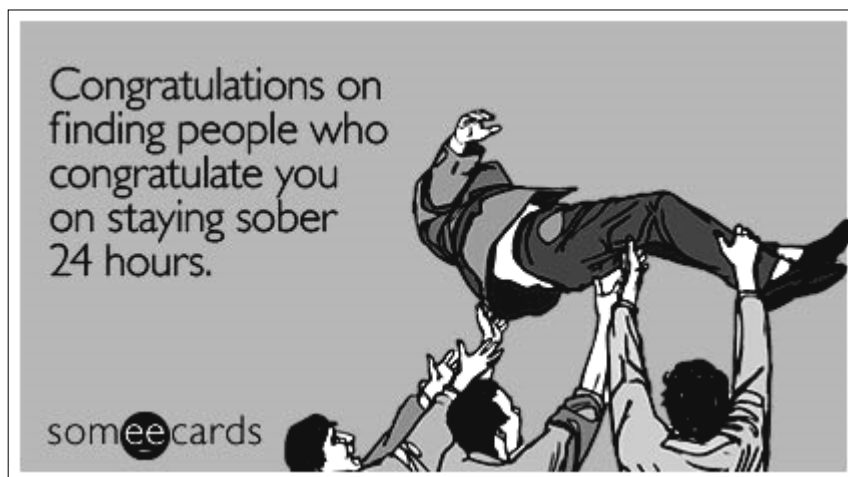
“Came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.”

I wasn't one that came in with faith, and the “GOD” word seemed to be on the other side of the imaginary line I drew in the sand. Thankfully to me the others in the rooms were patient with my obstinance.

Now that I have worked all the 12 steps, I have come to believe in a power greater than myself, and I see the importance of this step. This is where I started to believe that my best thinking was keeping me sick and suffering. That in some strange way the more energy I put trying to dig myself out of the mess I had made of my life, just kept getting deeper and more hopeless.

Step 2 was where I admitted that I was my biggest liability and made a choice to get out of my own way. Conforming to this step daily was the key to opening my mind so I could get the most out of the remaining steps. Conforming was not mindlessly following, it was a conscious decision to try what was working for others in the program.

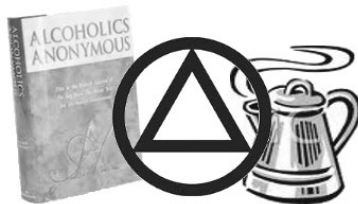

ATTENDANCE – GN (Chair), BC (Alt Chair), PB (Treasurer), MR (Alt Treasurer), SR (Secretary), FS (Office Mgr), DO (POST), PC (DCM), TR, MP, BK, JVB, Fred G, AT, JS, DL, JM, CH, PM, TS, MR, ST, NI, DH, MS.

MINUTES – November minutes on page 7 of the POST, read and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT – PB presented the report from page 10 of the POST; page 4 gives the final breakdown for the Gratitude Dinner; group donations for November are on page 8; approved. Effective 1/1/19, county sales tax will increase by 0.5% (from 6.5% to 7%). Credit card sales since IG started accepting total \$1652.68 (~\$1100 representing sales of cakes at the Gratitude Dinner).

PHONE COMMITTEE – SR presented; currently one vacancy Sunday night 10p-7a Monday morning has temporary coverage (MS interested in training, will be referred to SS). Regarding Phone Manual, MS noted that the AGH phone number is obsolete and other numbers may also need to be updated.

POST – DO presented & noted that wrong version was sent to printer (website version which only has initials) but correct versions are available by e-mail if requested; deadline for POST submissions is the 12th; back page has Alkathon announcement. PC asked if next POST could include birthdays in correct format; this will be done if space is available. Page 4 has future topics; all submissions are welcome and encouraged.

LITERATURE/MERCHANDISE/WHERE & WHEN – FS presented. IG office has several new pamphlets including “The God Word” and some pamphlets have new names; three new Grapevine books available. Quite a few meetings have cancelled/closed and the W/W being updated; expecting some new changes next week and then a new W/W will be submitted to the printer.

WEBSITE – GN presented (for WM); WM apologizes for his behavior at the last IG meeting, and will apologize in person at the next meeting. Alkathon schedule is on the website. FS commended WM on the work done on the website, a lot of work, meeting locations now link to Google maps.

ACTIVITIES – DO presented (for Jen H); reminded everyone about Alkathon; reminded to send activities in advance to the website (on page 6 of the POST); they will do everything possible to include activities in the POST and on the website.

DCM REPORT – PC stated that District 14 elections completed and all positions filled except CPCPI; new DCM is CM; area assembly next weekend (1/4/19-1/6/19) in St Augustine/World Golf Village. BC noted that website is aanorthflorida.org for the weekend schedule.

OLD BUSINESS – **1)** Alkathon meeting schedules available in print and on website; rent not being charged by the Triangle Club so basket is not passed for outside meetings. Since we are not paying rent (norm 9 meetings, \$180), Intergroup gave a donation (\$150) for coffee which will be available for free at the coffee bar; FS purchased snacks which will also be available. **2)** Proposal for guidelines for website events posting; wording changed to include events in the areas of Florida/South Georgia/Southeastern Alabama to be posted except General Service Conference meetings; this needs to be reviewed with William (regarding other exceptions including International); tabled for review until next IG meeting. **3)** MR made a motion “that the Freethinkers be added back to the meeting schedule with a notation that the group is geared toward atheists, agnostics, and believers.” GN has researched this issue with delegates related to “hot button topics” and informal votes at General Service Conference have been split; difficult to get substantial unanimity (ie 2/3 majority vote); notation regarding inclusivity of meeting would be clarification. Discussion held; Freethinkers NOT affiliated with AA Agnostica and wish to be included in W/W; NI clarified Freethinkers position, inclusivity, and registration status; FG states that they uphold the traditions. Vote taken to include Freethinkers in W/W with notation; 2 opposing votes (minority opinion by SR/DL with regard to changing the wording of Twelve Steps in any way); motion passes; FS will update W/W. District 14 will still need to approve for inclusion in the website since it is jointly owned with Intergroup. **4)** Thank you cards from panhandle groups read regarding the literature drive after Hurricane Michael.

NEW BUSINESS – **1)** SR - KK, alternate secretary and secretary for steering committee, had to resign due to family commitments; the majority of the work for steering committee is completed so IG secretary will assume those responsibilities; Intergroup now will need an alternate secretary and it is asked that this be announced to groups; questions answered (off the record, PC expressed interest in the position and will be placed in nomination at the next meeting). **2)** Intergroup office hours extended (Mon-Wed 2-5p, Thurs-Fri 12p-6p, Sat 11a-3p); minimum charge for credit card purchases will be \$25 effective immediately; office staff to be trained on usage. **3)** MP – regarding the violent outburst last month, suggestion regarding policy about violence in the meeting; as previously noted, parties involved have been spoken to and have apologized; not sober behavior. Chair has the option of expelling people from the meeting for behavior; no specific policy needed. **4)** DL – regarding overhead lights in the hall being out; FS clarified that we do not “rent” the hall but do make donations; FS proposes that we make a donation to pay for new light bulbs (to be installed by the owners of the facility to avoid liability issues).
