HOPE, BELIEF, FAITH, or TRUST

If you're sober enough to read the P.O.S.T., then perhaps you have found all four of these things! On the other hand, my transition from one to the next has been a very slow existential evolution- a long series of growth opportunities for which I am now very grateful. Although my spiritual development has been painstakingly sluggish, the rewards have been literally priceless. No pain. no gain....

Arriving in a hopeless state of decay, it was hard to believe that a program, a group of people, or a Higher Power could possibly offer anything like redemption for a badly broken mind, body, and spirit. Nonetheless, I could clearly see that many of my brothers and sisters had come from that harrowing and horrifying place of "pitiful and incomprehensible demoralization" and most seemed well adjusted and even happy. Most had faith and trust in their Creator and seemed very content! All I ever wanted was peace. Was it possible?

The question would be "how do I find a faith that works?". The Big Book and the 12 & 12 are veritable goldmines for spiritual help. When the student is ready, the teacher appears! And so it was for me- the journey had begun. I had faith that a very large group of people had tapped some kind of Divine Guidance resource. Oddly, my many years of studying psychology, religion, and philosophy had not solved the riddle. I had acquired quite an impressive library, including a wide assortment of "self help" books. Somehow this had no effect on my willfulness, my struggles with life. It is absolutely true that most of us are great students, fairly bright, and real tough fighters. You have to be tough to stay alive through countless years of alcohol addition with all the associated chicanery.

It took many years of recovery to finally realize that the key was so very simple, and it was right in front of me the whole time. The solution was, of course, SURRENDER.. The cryptic old-timers would talk about God's will: if I have an open heart and a quiet mind I will actually know it when I see it. I have found that to be absolutely true. Today, my life is as simple as "doing the next right thing" and surrendering to how God "unfolds" my day. The sign on the wall says "trust God, clean house, help others". Turns out that most of the minute details are really "above my pay grade". I simply "suit up and show up". All I ever wanted is peace, and here it is! ~Anonymous

When I was first introduced to Step 3 it seemed more complex than I could understand. Then my sponsor broke it down to simple easy terms, which is what I really required. It was simply "Making a DECISION" to turn my Will and my Life over. I could do that. I prayed to a GOD I still didn't believe in for willingness. I gradually became willing to change my will – my dialogue with myself (my thoughts and words) as well as my life which is my behaviors and actions toward others.

I still work Step 3 on a daily basis. I know when I'm not doing it because I revert back to my old behaviors - run that old tape in my mind telling myself that recovery isn't for me. That cycle of irritable, restless and discontent comes back and I know that I'm taking my will back. So, I make the decision again, and get out of the driver's seat.

I believe Tradition Three is the reason AA has survived and thrives today. I believe it is the reason I and many other alcoholics are alive today. The early AAs were very fearful that the wrong kind of member might spoil or ruin AA because the organization was so new and they understood their lives depended upon the existence of AA. Thus each AA group put many restrictions on about who was allowed to join. They did not want to be associated with undesirables who would give AA a bad reputation, they were respectable alcoholics. It seems difficult to believe now. Eventually the he restrictions began to be lifted after the first "drug addict" and the first "non-believer" were admitted. Both these men proved to be great AAs who helped many people during their recovery.

I am a member of AA because I say I am a member. I was dying when I came to AA. What if I had been told women weren't allowed, old people couldn't join, Northerners weren't welcome, Catholics weren't allowed, and I talked too much. Thank God none of that happened. I was welcomed with open arms. No one said "you haven't hit your bottom yet." I had found my tribe, a family who understood me better than my family of origin. I am forever grateful.

Now I must give what was given freely to me. I actively welcome all new members. It doesn't matter who they are, where they came from, we do not discuss their religion, their politics. These issues are irrelevant in AA. I only need to know that this person is another suffering alcoholic like me. I reach out my hand and say Welcome to AA, I'm






The February issue of the P.O.S.T. is the most recent and on Page 8 it shows the Intergroup Treasurer's Report for all of 2018. The annual office and operating expenses totaled about \$19,400. The services provided by these expenses include a 24-hour hotline for 12th step calls, an informational website, printed meeting schedules, sales of conference-approved literature, help with the coordination and promotion of group activities, publication on-line and in-print of the monthly newsletter, etc. These expenses were paid with net income from sales (sales – cost of goods

sold) of about \$4,600, group contributions of about \$7,500, and proceeds from the Gratitude Dinner of about \$7,700, totaling about \$19,800. The Gratitude Dinner is supposed to be about gratitude, not about raising money to keep Intergroup afloat. In December 2018, less than \$500 was made in group contributions while office/operating expenses totaled over \$1,400. This was not an isolated occurrence.

In all of 2018, income only barely covered expenses, and sales and group contributions are still not enough to keep the doors of Intergroup open. What does this mean? Do we think Intergroup serves our AA community? Do we think it is important enough to support financially? In AA, we each have one vote, whether it be in an AA business meeting, with our feet, or with our pocketbooks.

I have resolved that I am grateful for the role of Intergroup in our community and that I will show that gratitude by becoming a Faithful Fiver, donating \$5 each month to Intergroup. I will also show my gratitude by asking my home group to consider increasing the percentage of our 7th Tradition distributions to Intergroup because that is where the greatest need is at the moment. If I want the Gratitude Dinner to be about gratitude and not about raising money, I must show my gratitude to our Intergroup throughout the year with my pocketbook. I ask you, my fellow members of AA, to consider doing the same.

MINUTES – December minutes on page 6 of POST; read and approved. PC voted in to serve as Alternate Secretary. **TREASURER'S REPORT** – MR presented the report from page 8 of the POST. Page 7 shows individual group contributions for December totaling \$495.65. Group donations for 2018 on page 12 of POST. Future issues will include monthly donations only (no running tally). Yearly totals will be published in January issue.

PHONE COMMITTEE - SS not present but it was reported all slots are filled.

POST – DO reminded us there is space on the last page of the POST for events. If you have events, contact the activities chair so your event gets exposure via flyer and/or Community News. DO makes it easy and will work with you if it is not print ready. Deadline is the 12th of the month.

LITERATURE/MERCHANDISE/WHERE & WHEN – FS reported a new Where & When is out with 7 meeting changes. One came in too late for this printing but has been added to website Where & When. Intergroup has the new **Grapevine** available at the office along with several newly altered pamphlets including **Women in AA** and **LGBTQ**.

WEBSITE – WM made an amends to the group. He reported he is progressing on making our website interactive. It is a huge job. There are 183 meetings in our Where & When.

ACTIVITIES – JH reported it is pretty quiet right now. She reminded everyone to send activities to her at <u>activities@aagainesville.org</u>. Please give her a few days advance notice and she will see that it gets published on our website and in the POST if she receives it in time.

DCM REPORT – DA, Alternate DCM, reported District still needs an Alt Secretary and Alt Treasurer. If interested, see him or attend District meeting. Plans are underway for a Service Fair to be done in the original style which included lots of fun activities. At Area Assembly he learned of a new app which was purchased by World Service. It will initially have meeting schedules, Daily Reflections and Chapter 5 of the *Big Book* but will eventually expand to include GSR kits, Archive materials, a podcast and much more.

FCYPAA – BH reported on two events: *Sober Love* on February 16th at 7pm at the Triangle Club. It will include a spaghetti dinner followed by a speaker, cake auction and raffle. There will be special pricing for the FCYPAA Convention (being held on June 7th through 9th at the UF Hilton): \$25 gets you convention registration and a t-shirt. Next meeting for the Host Committee is on February 3rd at 1pm at the Triangle Club.

OLD BUSINESS – WM presented amended "Proposed Guidelines for Events Listings on Intergroup's Website." Most significant changes include minor alterations in items 1, 2 and 5: timeline, location, and an addition to allow exceptions to guidelines to include "...or by the Webmaster exercising the "Service Authority defined in World Service Concept 10". Motion to accept was made and seconded. Motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS – 1) KM, new CPC/PI District Chair spoke to the group about her committee and what they want to do. Committee members can choose to participate by speaking to the public (recommended at least two years of continuous sobriety) and there are also other ways to serve while maintaining anonymity. If interested, meetings are held on the 1st Thursday at 6:30 at the Triangle Club. 2) JF reminded us we need to elect one new Board Member. BC stood and was elected to serve. 3) JF asked that Intergroup look into purchasing insurance to alleviate any legal liability to Board Members. FS will look into it. 4) JF asked about attendance requirements for Board Members. GN will check the bylaws to see if it specifically addresses those requirements for the Board. 5) FS brought up the ongoing conditions at Schaeffer Hall (lighting, bathrooms, etc.) and suggested moving the monthly Intergroup meeting to the Triangle Club. Moving would save Intergroup \$110 annually (\$240 annually as compared to current price of \$350 annually). Motion made and accepted to move Intergroup meeting to Triangle Club starting February meeting.
