# Becoming Willing

Willing for what? We were all being chased by something or someone when we got here, but most of us would not admit it. I was willing to get away from the "posse", go to treatment, and hide from the impending doom that had arrived in my life (the law). I had suspected for some time that my erratic behavior might eventually catch someone's eye! I was absolutely sure that my freedom and my chemical peace of mind was at stake! This simply meant that it was once again time to hunker down, regroup, and figure out what "plan B" looks like. Fortunately, I was out of all contingency plans.

In a number of AA meetings I was hearing about "willingness versus willfulness"- really didn't get the full impact of what that was all about, but I could see that my life skills and management clearly had not been working. The men and women around me were indeed willing to try new ideas and they seemed to be getting good results! I had nothing to lose but my exaggerated state of misery. I was perhaps ready to accept some directions from a sponsor and my peers!

It really came down to a few simple concepts. Would I be willing to trust in a God that I could not define or explain? Would I be willing to "clean house"- take a good long look at my assets and liabilities with the help of experienced men who are well acquainted with this type of soul-searching inventory? Would I be willing to "get right" with the human race and be an active participating member of society? In other words- would I be willing to become the honorable and respectable person I was supposed to be all along? After all, that is the main purpose and outcome of the steps...

The late great Sandy B. talked about this being a "result oriented program" - thank God for that! The result I had hoped for included true peace of mind, a purpose, and relative freedom from fear. The idea that I can trust God instead of living in abject dread was so attractive that I was willing to go to any lengths to have this kind of serenity. I truly pray that I will always have that kind of willingness.

The result is an open heart and a quiet mind.



### "Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves."

What is it about Step 4 that causes so many AA's anxiety. Why are these things so difficult to write down on paper?

For me, I used the excuse of not wanting to bring up those things I had put into my past as a way to avoid doing the work. I could not imagine how this step could relieve me of my difficulties. And this was the problem... I was unable to believe. Steps 2, and 3 suggested that this "faith" was necessary and I can see now that I became willing to try when I exercised the trust in my sponsor, the others in the fellowship and the program itself. I decided to try and I sincerely (and secretly) hoped that it would work for me. And it did.

Someone I respect greatly says "A small amount of willingness creates more willingness" ... and it took a lot of it for me to get through step 4. To put pen to paper and write a history of my resentments and wrongs. This simple act started the action part of my program, and through this the promises started coming true in my recovery.


## Community News


- Intergroup Office and the Hotline received 49 calls in February.

## Tradition 4

The Steps are HOW IT WORKS.

The Traditions are WHY IT WORKS.

Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or AA as a whole.

This tradition seems to be a no brainer, but once again, it is the result of a negative experience as explained in the 12 and 12.

The common welfare of AA as a whole is paramount. Therefore, the General Service Organization should be consulted before an AA group, regional committee or an individual take action which might affect AA as a whole. At the local level, each group is on its own unless the group conscience might affect the welfare of neighboring groups.

An example is the responsibility to maintain good relations with meeting site landlords. What is true for the individual, is also true for the group, we might be the only example of the Big Book a landlord (a church or community center, etc.) might see. Each group should be very aware of the care taken of the facility, paying rent on time, and following any guidelines the landlord provides regarding smoking, parking, food and pets. Such cooperation builds rapport with the community.

None of this is hard, the group's responsibility is an extension of the AA member's responsibility. I am responsible for carrying the message to anyone anytime anywhere when someone reaches out for help.


## **Community Service Opportunity!**

**ATTENDANCE** – BC (alt chair), SR (secretary), PC (alt secretary), PB (treasurer), MR (alt treasurer), FS (office mgr), SS (phones), DO (POST), WM (webmaster), DA (alt DCM), SL, AM, MR, NI, JS, JM, JM, JH, CH, AW, AO, ST, NL.

MINUTES - January 2019 minutes on page 6 of the POST; read and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT – PB presented the Treasurer's Report from page 8 of the POST; this included the annual corporate filing fee of \$61.25 and the deposit for the Gratitude Dinner hall rental. There was a separate balance sheet distributed covering the breakdown of specific IG office accounts (expenses, sales, group contributions) for 2017/2018. JM inquired about the amount of prudent reserves especially related to the Gratitude Dinner; FS responded with the status of costs and that Gratitude Dinner funds are now being detailed separately from other IG office accounts. Motion was made and passed to approve the report.

**PHONE COMMITTEE** – SS presented the report and noted that all slots were currently filled, but that there was one potential opening awaiting confirmation. She reported on the new buddy system whereby new members on the grid were paired with a more experienced member for support, and it is working well.

**POST** – DO reviewed the POST, and noted that there was some confusion regarding birthdays as some were sent to her and some to the POST e-mail; she will clarify and correct. She also pointed out the article by TD in "Opinion Matters", and said that they are always open to ideas for topics.

**LITERATURE & MERCHANDISE/WHERE & WHEN** – FS presented the report noting that the IG office is fully stocked and new Grapevines are in. The new W&W is now available; it is bright yellow and has the current date on the front.

**WEBSITE** – WM stated that the website is currently up to date.

**ACTIVITIES** – DO presented. Upcoming events include the 15<sup>th</sup> Annual Soberstock. FCYPAA will be holding their state convention here in June; it is the same weekend as Founder's Day which was overlooked during planning, but may increase attendance. The Saturday Morning 10<sup>th</sup>/11<sup>th</sup> Step Group will be hosting a meditation workshop on March 30 and flyers were circulated; there was some discussion as to the wording on the flyers as this is an open event (not strictly AA), but the flyer does not state that it is an AA event. There was discussion about the wording with regard to this as well as other events, but no change was made.

**DCM REPORT** – DA (Alt DCM) presented the report and announced that there will be a meeting on 3/24/19 from 2:30-5pm at the Triangle Club to review conference agenda items. The same type of meeting will be held in Ocala on 3/23/19. District is working on having a Service Fair.

**OLD BUSINESS** – (1) There was previous discussion regarding the need for IG to have liability insurance; FS had made some calls but did not get responses; JF gave information about one quote; BC noted that to his knowledge, there have been no lawsuits. The topic was tabled. (2) The question had previously been raised about whether or not Intergroup Corporate Board members needed to attend Intergroup meetings. GN (IG chair) is absent and may have more information about this. However, as they are only figureheads for the nonprofit filing and have no real responsibilities, it is likely that they do not need to attend IG meetings.

**NEW BUSINESS** – (1) There was discussion regarding the "Opinion Matters" article in the POST about "Faithful Fivers", and a flyer was available for members to take back to their groups for circulation/discussion. (2) A motion was made to establish the Intergroup office prudent reserve at \$10,800 (6 months of expenses). The motion was passed after discussion; this is the goal to in that it "cooperates" with AA, but is not "affiliated" AA in work toward, but IG is not currently at that point. (3) Clarification was made with regard to the status of Intergroup a business sense.

There being no further business, motion was made and passed to adjourn.


