

Listening for the Whisper of Humility

As we advance through the steps we realize that we all actually have a built in "Spiritual Guidance System" that our Creator installed. Almost every culture and society addresses this reality, and our founders felt that it was incredibly important to become "attuned" to the Source of our spiritual connection (step 11),

It would seem that the net effect of each of the steps is humility- a much needed asset for my spiritual development. Step 1 has me admit and accept powerlessness over alcohol (and many other things). The step work also shows me that my thinking is generally unmanageable. This realization in itself is humbling. Steps 2 and 3 have me "trust God" as I risk summing my willfulness to a Higher Power- also a humbling experience. Steps 4 through 9 help me become "right-sized" in what I call the "garbage-removal steps"...all are exercises in humility. Step 10 is simply a regular house cleaning (humility maintenance) in order to maintain and promote spiritual growth.

Now is where I get into cosmic "4th dimension" territory in Step 11 as I continually practice having an active, two-way communication with my Creator. This requires me to have a somewhat quiet mind and an open heart, and the ability to pay very careful attention to the "small voice". That "intuitive" direction I get from this practice of prayer and meditation is very subtle but very real. It is also frustrating that my mind can be so undisciplined, rowdy, defiant, and downright deafening.

Nonetheless, I am so grateful for the opportunity to practice listening for that small voice of enlightenment and direction. The practice gets better every year. I fully accept that I will fall short on a daily basis. I need only keep trying to get closer to God's will...

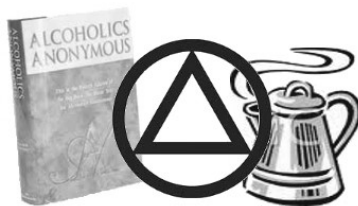

ATTENDANCE – GN (Chair), BC (Alt Chair), SR (Secretary), PC (Alt Secretary), PB (Treasurer), FS (Office Mgr), JH (Activities), DO (POST), WM (Webmaster), PA (AIAnon), TR, BB, AM, WL, MP, MN, JS, DL, HG, JF, CH, AW, ST, NL, JB, TL, MR, BM, DK.

MINUTES – SR presented the April minutes on page 6 of the POST; read and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT – PB presented the Treasurer's report on page 7 of the POST. Of note, due to a miscalculation in the Excel worksheet, sales tax was misrepresented which resulted in an additional \$1268.42 when the bank reconciliation was completed. Contributions by Faithful \$5ers & \$10ers of \$270 was moved into the prudent reserve. Corporate filing with the State has been completed, and sales tax was paid as of April. There was a reimbursement from the Website committee from 2018 of \$295.63.

PHONE COMMITTEE – SR reported for SS; one vacancy on Sunday 4-7pm (this has since been filled).

POST – DeO reminded everyone that the deadline is back to the 12th of the month. She again asked that last initials be included in the birthday submissions. The POST is always looking for writers (see page 4 of the POST for topics) and event submissions.

LITERATURE/MERCHANDISE/WHERE & WHEN – FS reported that everything was up to date and fully stocked. He highlighted several flyers (Grapevine books \$13/book, Intergroup office literature sale on 6/1 from 11a-3p). He also circulated flyers highlighting that the POST is available for home delivery for \$11/year (see page 4 of the POST).

WEBSITE – WM reported that the website is currently up to date. He is working on creating an interactive Where & When and is making progress on the backside (the mechanics which we don't readily see); he will be doing a Beta test with the integrated app. He hopes to eventually have it capable of linking with the MeetingGuide.aa.org app.

ACTIVITIES – JH announced that there would be a Memorial Day celebration at the Primary Purpose Club on 5/27. The 352 FCYPAA Conference will be 6/7-6/9 at the University Hilton. The Emotional Sobriety Conference will be 6/21-6/23 at the Fairfield. Founders Day is to be held on 6/8 at Trinity UMC; the next committee meeting is Tuesday, 5/21, 7pm at the Triangle Club.

DCM REPORT – GN reported (as there was no rep from District); the District 14 minutes and announcements are on page 9-10 of the POST. Area Assembly is in July. A Corrections Chair and an Accessibilities Chair are needed.

FCYPAA – SN announced that the tickets for the conference would increase from \$20 to \$25 effective 5/20. The website is publicly accessible; you can volunteer on the website and there is also a link on the Intergroup webpage.

OLD BUSINESS – FS reported that for now, Intergroup would be allowed to remain in the current office space, but that the rent might be raised (how much is not known at this time).

NEW BUSINESS – JB announced the Hawthorne Group Picnic on 8/17 (pgs 2 & 12 of the POST) at Luther Springs; attendance is free. They are requesting \$200 from Intergroup; motion was made and passed. Wanda L reminded attendees to take flyers for the Emotional Sobriety Conference. Phil A introduced himself as the new AIAnon outreach and said that they would have a table at Founders Day; in the future, they would like to continue to attend Intergroup meetings; he was made welcome.

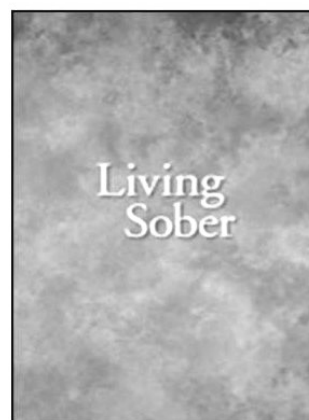

Alcoholics Anonymous has no governing body, it has no leaders with ruling power. What we do have is a system of areas consisting of Districts, which are governed by the individual groups of AA. Each group gets a GSR to represent that group at the District and Area level. The GSR's job is to ensure that the voice of the groups conscious is heard. Individual alcoholics can get involved by joining committees within their District such as Corrections, Treatment, Literature, so on. At the Committee level each alcoholic gets a voice and a vote. **Alcoholics anonymous is a true democracy in that each vote gets counted and each and every single voice is heard.** The best way to preserve a Democracy is to participate in it and as of this moment, participation in the service work and Committees of District 14 is at an all-time low.
