The idea that I would experience a "psychic change" by working and applying the steps to my life was something I would have to take on faith. It took quite some time for me to surrender, to submit fully to working the steps (principles) in daily life. The transformation was slow, but I came to realize at some point that the chaos and drama of my old life was almost completely gone. At first the sense of peace was unnerving! I had always wanted an open heart and a quiet mind, but thought that it might be impossible for a guy like me. I feel closer to God and my fellow humans as a result of this inexplicable spiritual shift in consciousness. My sponsor humorously suggested that I wallow in it- peace looks good on everybody.....



Impossible to see, measure, or fully define, the "forth dimension" is a plane of existence available to us all! The steps allow me to do those three simple things: seek God, clean house, and help others. My spiritual growth slowly continues as I follow these principles, falling short every day. I am forever indebted to AA and my Higher Power for a new life. My gratitude will be expressed by my actions!

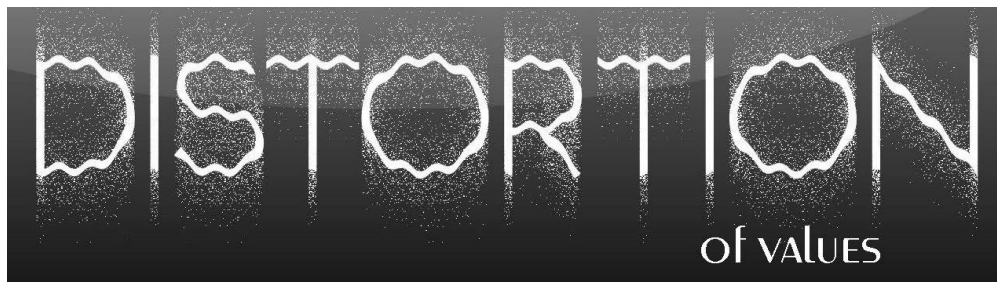

Step 9

“Made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.”

“Our real purpose is to fit ourselves to be of maximum service to God and the people about us,” reads the Big Book.

We are putting our lives in order with the 9th Step. It is just after completion of this Step, actually, when the Promises appear in the Big Book: “We will suddenly realize that God is doing for us what we could not do for ourselves.”

Making amends is not easy, as the Grapevine stories in this section will show. One writer felt she needed to take responsibility and make amends for her part in an abusive relationship. Another AA was able to make amends to his violent, alcoholic father long after the father had died. A third admits to stealing a wallet from a favorite uncle.

None of these amends came simply, but with consultation with sponsors and other AAs, prayer, and guidance from a Higher Power.

A member who had embezzled a large amount of money from an employer writes in a 2006 Grapevine story that his sponsor advised him to turn himself in and make amends; he initially says no. “I knew that I really had no choice. I wanted the Promises that are promised to each of us. I needed this lifted from my shoulders, or I would drink again.” Because of this amends he spends 18 months in jail, but realizes, “When I am released, I will be 6 years sober, a free man with no baggage or secrets.”

Scary as this process is, it is vital in our recovery from alcoholism. “We are willing. We have to be,” the Big Book says. “We must not shrink at anything”.

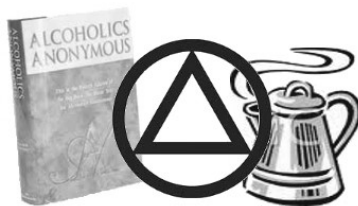

ATTENDANCE – GN (Chair), BC (Alt Chair), SR (Secretary), PC (Alt Secretary), PB (Treasurer), MR (Alt Treasurer), FS (Office Mgr), JH (Activities), DO (POST), WM (Webmaster), TR, BB, AM, BK, BM, NI, JVB, DL, TC, KW, JH, JM, GM, CH, AW, AO, ST, NL, SW, RM, SC, DK, MR.

MINUTES – SR presented the June minutes (pg 6 of the POST), read and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT – PB presented the June treasurer's report (pg 7 of the POST); he noted that the rent and office manager's salary represented two months of expenses due to date distributed; Gratitude Dinner facility rental of \$750 has been paid YTD; there is a \$190 adjustment that is currently under investigation and he should have an explanation next month. The prudent reserve as of the end of June, 2019 is \$6500 (with a goal of \$10,000).

PHONE COMMITTEE – SR presented; there is currently only one vacancy, Monday 5-7pm.

POST – DO presented; the POST continues to solicit help with writing articles and is looking for input for future topics; she advised that with the holidays coming up, deadlines would be shortened and she would remind everyone as that time approached.

LITERATURE & MERCHANDISE/WHERE & WHEN – FS reported that the new Grapevine is in stock. He also showed the type of envelope that is used for mailing out the POST to subscribers (discrete manila envelope). The updated Where & When including all address changes for meetings relocated with the Spirit of Truth Church location change have been submitted and should be available shortly. The IG office also has new birthday cards in stock.

WEBSITE – WM reported that all website changes are up to date; any changes submitted are usually updated the same or next day. Events sent in to the Activities e-mail address as uploaded to the website. The Meeting Guide app database is supported by Intergroup and utilizes the same large server as the meetings listing on the website.

ACTIVITIES – JH reported for Activities, noting several upcoming weekend conferences including the 63rd Florida State Convention; all are listed under events on the Intergroup website. Of note, on 8/25/19, District/Area will be holding a workshop "The Future Orange Badges" at the Triangle Club from 2-5pm. There will be a speaker and lunch at the Triangle Club on Labor Day, Monday, 9/2/19; speaker at 12:30pm with lunch to follow. Dorie K handed out flyers about the 11th Annual Hawthorne Picnic at Luther Springs Retreat on Saturday, 8/17/19, 11am-4pm, bring a side dish to share.

DCM REPORT – DCM was not present, but GN noted that there would be a panel discussion at the "Future Orange Badges" workshop on 8/25/19 with members sharing their knowledge.

YPAA – ST noted that the 2020 FCYPAA will be in Miami; Ocala will be holding bid committee meetings.

OLD BUSINESS – The pamphlet "Introducing Your North Central Florida Intergroup" has been completed; PC noted a couple of typos which will be corrected prior to sending to the printer. Per FS, the pamphlet will be part of a 7th Tradition packet which will have several different pamphlets and will be available at the Intergroup office. GN stated that the Gratitude Dinner has been set for Saturday, 11/23/19; the location has been reserved; there is no football game that weekend. The first Gratitude Dinner committee meeting will be on Tuesday, 8/27/19 at 6:30pm at the Triangle Club.

NEW BUSINESS – WM discussed that the website expenses include the ownership fee for four (4) domain names that have been in use at different times; the renewal is coming due for these and he recommended that we renew all four (4) names for a cost of \$18/year. If an outdated domain name is selected, there will be a notice that will redirect to the current domain. BC asked if it is possible to count how many hits are on the outdated domains; WM said that he would see if this was possible. MR noted that one of the previously mentioned upcoming activities (Women In Recovery in Delray Beach) is not strictly AA sponsored but is open to all recovery groups; he asked if this event should be advertised on the Intergroup website events. WM and BC noted that Intergroup is not an AA affiliated organization, and based on previous discussions in this regard, recovery events have been allowed.

There being no further discussion, the meeting was closed with the Responsibility Pledge.

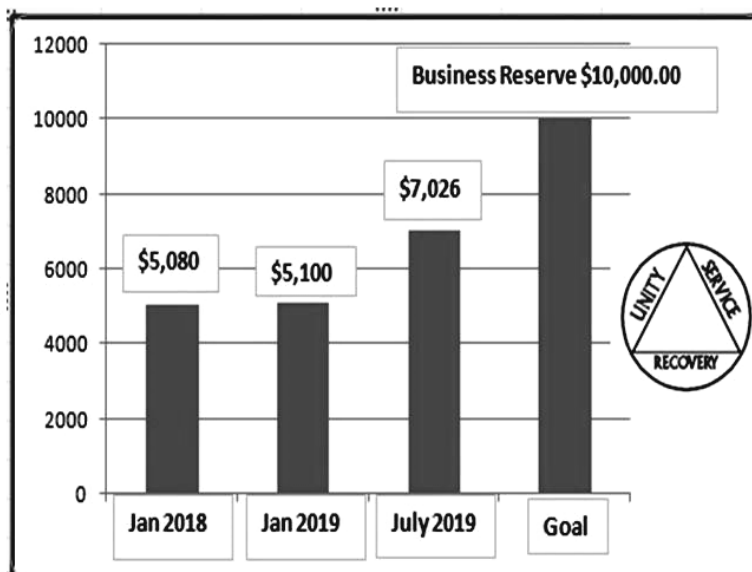

Hello All,

I attended area assembly in July and we had the lowest GSR turn out that we have ever had, with 9 GSRs totaling 10 votes, including my vote. We also had several visitors. The best part of area assembly this past time was by far the fellowship. Seeing friends that I only see at area assembly, hanging out and eating meals with friends from Gainesville and arguing over motions and workshop issues with the person that I was sitting next to is a unique area experience. Over all area was a fun and fulfilling experience

One bit of big news for our district and an issue I am sure a lot of people will have an opinion on is a change to District 14 Structure and Guidelines. The change would be to add two new positions to the district, one being a District 14 Intergroup Liaison and the other would be a District 14 Registrar. Both of these positions would have a 6 month sobriety suggestion, neither would be a committee chair person position and both would free up more of the DCMs time and energy, to allow the DCM to focus on what is important which is helping the committees and GSRs and individual alcoholics to engage in 12th step work. These positions would not be a change to any particular, in existence job, they would merely fill in a gap that exists and would most benefit future DCMs and the District/Intergroup relationship. Hopefully your GSR was at the District business meeting, has hand-outs were given. A lot of information was covered.

One interesting thing that very briefly came up at District and has been talked about before was the idea that perhaps District 14 is too big of a district and should we consider dividing it up into a District 14 A and B? This has several advantages and disadvantages. Here is my point of view: Not everyone is up to this time commitment and stress involved with the position. I feel that anything that we can do to lessen the burden on future DCMs is not only a kind thing to do, but also a necessity. I believe that it would be prudent to begin by adding the two position of Intergroup Liaison and Registrar. Do we need to split the District up? I do not know. Do we have to add these two new positions? That is for the home groups to decide and the GSRs to vote on. I am but a humble servant. Perhaps there are other alternatives out there, I would enjoy hearing about them, so please don't be shy. Until then, thank you for allowing me to be of service.
