Truly I have often been extremely uncomfortable receiving anything in my adult life. A compliment might make me feel unworthy or embarrassed. A birthday gift makes me feel unworthy, vulnerable, and obliged as well. The intimacy involved in receiving a gift is a much bigger deal than I thought and has been a source of spiritual growth.


I was in a morning meeting many years ago when one of the founders of the group pulled me aside after the closing prayer. She had noticed that I had refused help for a project I was working on at my house, even though I could have used assistance. She sat me down and called me a thief of all things! Her point was that she knew I really enjoyed helping others but would not allow other folks to have that same enjoyment by helping me. She was spot on, although I did not admit it at the time. I was missing out on giving the gift of accepting help. That has given me much to inventory!

The gift of receiving is indeed a spiritual process. The act of becoming open and vulnerable to the love from another person is a 2-way gift for both people, and a willing human connection between the two. The disease of alcoholism clearly thrives best when we are in a state of isolation - the act of giving and receiving breaks the painful and destructive isolation that, ultimately, is responsible for the slow and tortuous death of most of us. We absolutely need each other!



It is ironic that the thing I claim to fear and detest the most, human contact, is actually my most important life-line - my most valuable asset. The act of receiving is a very important spiritual part of that. The most common form for me is the act of using the telephone. This keeps me connected to a vast network of my brothers and sisters in recovery.... active examples of service in both directions. I've also noticed that being part of an actual interactive telephone call is much different than bouncing texts back and forth. I now see the wisdom of the older sponsors insisting on daily calling!

Thank God that we must connect with each other to survive this awful deadly disease. We have to far exceed our comfort zone in order to achieve freedom from the bondage of self, and it is necessary to continually do so on a daily basis. Complacency, defiance. and isolation will always be our constant enemies!







The Steps are HOW IT WORKS. The Traditions are <u>WHY IT WORKS</u>.

"Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio and film."

Long form: Our relations with the general public should be characterized by personal anonymity. We think AA out to avoid sensational advertising. Our names and pictures as AA members ought not be broadcast, filmed, or publicly printed. Our public relations policy should be guided by the principle of attraction rather than promotion. There is never need to praise ourselves. We feel it better to let our friends recommend us.

The principle of this tradition is self restraint and anonymity. As I heard in a meeting regarding this tradition "Ego is fueled by publicity; Humility is a by-product of anonymity".

..."To us, however, [Tradition 11] represents far more than a sound public relations policy. It is more than a denial of self-seeking. This tradition is a constant and practical reminder that personal ambition has no place in AA. In it, each member becomes an active guardian of our Fellowhip."

In this time, I feel very close to the universe, to all the forces for good in the world, to my higher power, to my fellow man Sometimes I am lucky enough to find myself in that very special place of complete peace. There are many names for this, but for me it is "heaven on earth. I have been practicing meditation for all the years I have been sober. I am sure it has helped me grow spiritually and saved my life by improving my health. Another gift for which I am grateful.



ATTENDANCE – GN (Chair), BC (Alt Chair), SR (Secretary), PB (Treasurer), MR (Alt Treas), FS (Office Mgr), DO (POST), WM (Webmaster), BB, AM, MR, WL, BM, MS, DL, JM, CH, AO, ST, NL, NF, SW.

MINUTES – SR presented the August minutes (page 7 of the POST), read and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT – PB reviewed the August treasurer's report (page 8 of the POST); prudent reserve is up to \$7200; reviewed and approved.

PHONE COMMITTEE – SR reported for SS; the phone grid is full at this time.

POST – DO noted that the submission deadline for the November and December issues will be early due the holidays (the exact deadline will be announced next month after consultation with the printer); topics are needed. It was suggested that the announcement at the bottom of the previous minutes have the projected next Intergroup meeting date due to the lag time between submissions, printing, and distribution (for example, the August minutes which are printed in the October issue of the POST should have the upcoming October Intergroup meeting date rather than the September date).

LITERATURE & MERCHANDISE/WHERE & WHEN – FS reported that a new printing of the W&W is in progress; Hawthorne has a new literature meeting on Tuesday at 5:30pm (on the website, name not yet decided, pamphlet discussion). Gratitude Dinner tickets are on sale at the Intergroup office and will soon be generally available.

WEBSITE – WM reported that the website is up-to-date; the link on the committee page for CPCPI is now active. He reviewed the number of hits on the old and the new websites, but stated that he can't tell how many are authentic searches/ hits.

ACTIVITIES – DO reported for Activities. The Gratitude Dinner is Saturday, 11/23/19, 4pm at Springhill Baptist Church, and tickets are \$10; the next committee meeting is Monday, 10/8/19, 6:30pm at the Triangle Club.

DCM REPORT – There was no DMC report; voting at District regarding establishing the DCM liaison position is still pending.

OLD BUSINESS – FCYPAA has been disbanded; the newly established group is GRYPAA (Gainesville Region of Young People in AA).

NEW BUSINESS – SR has resigned as secretary of IG effective 10/1/19 due to relocation (her current term would be up after 12/2019); Pati C will continue as alternate secretary but does not wish to assume the position of secretary. SW asked about linking District service coordinators e-mail addresses, but per WM (webmaster), the service coordinators would have to be willing to have their e-mail addresses linked and there is also the question of computer literacy with regard to linking the e-mails.

There being no further business, the meeting was closed with the Responsibility Pledge.

Whatever happened to the alcoholics anonymous that I fell in love with?

Around 9 years ago when I was first getting sober, I would go to beginners meetings and hear old timers with 20 plus years sobriety passionately declaring that new comers should work the steps or die. I go to the same meetings and the "oldest members have 5 to 10 years and the topic has to do with anything but the 12 steps. I would go to speaker meetings and the speaker would talk about the 12 steps and the 12 traditions and service work carrying the message of aa to the still suffering alcoholic, now I keep hearing public 5th steps and opinions on outside issues. Is it those newcomers being newcomers? Is it an issue of the old timers "retiring" from service work? And honestly who cares whose fault it is? The important question is what are we going to do about it?

I don't have an answer. What I can do is be an ACTIVE member of alcoholics anonymous. I can go to meetings and I can share about the steps and traditions. I can go to more meetings and get involved with home groups. I can go to committee meetings, I can go to district. The most important thing I can do while getting involved is to ask questions, make comments, and share my experience strength and hope. I can help propagate a discussion on how we can better carry the message of alcoholics anonymous to other alcoholics (step 12) and I can help elevate the discussion of how are we giving back what was so freely given to us. I can take personal responsibility and invest my time and energies into our community.

I am a fairly proud man, due to the things I have survived and the work I have done with others. I tend walk about this earth with my head held high; but if I have to I will get on my knees and beg you to get involved. To the newcomer, get involved, your disease is outside doing pushups, getting stronger. To the old timer, that tingling in your back is not another ailment, it's your next relapse breathing down your neck, get involved. I will continue to trudge the happy road of destiny and while I would rather see you walking it with me, I will not hesitate to step over your corpse, if necessary.

Abraham Lincoln said it best when he declared "The dogmas of the quit past are inadequate to the stormy present. The occasion is piled high with difficulty and we must rise with the occasion. As our case is new, so must we think anew and act anew."
