Luck or grace, two very different concepts, yet the end result seems to be the same. I am so lucky to be sober. But I think it is the grace of my higher that got me sober and keeps me sober. I no longer see all good fortune in my life as the result of luck. It is grace, a gift from my higher power. Luck is random, I don't deserve good luck or bad luck. Neither can I earn grace. Winning the lottery is lucky, I stay sober by grace.



I am of Irish descent and grew up hearing about the "luck of the Irish." The truth is that Irish history is marked by oppression, famine, discrimination and rampant alcoholism. Not really a story of a lucky people. However, the Irish still feel "lucky." Perhaps it is the beauty of their homeland, their sense of humor, or simply tradition which makes them feel lucky. If you were born Irish, you're lucky enough.

Or perhaps they have a faith in a power greater than themselves who is their source of strength. My faith makes it possible to face each day with a positive attitude. Whatever happens, I know I am not alone. I can reach out to my higher power to comfort me and guide me. Only by reaching out to my higher power was I finally able to stay sober for a single day, and then the day after that, and the day after that, and the day after that. I received grace and guidance as I followed the journey of early sobriety. Why me and not someone else? I do not know; I have no explanation.

The guidance I need comes through my sponsor the rooms of AA and following the 12 steps of AA. For me AA remains a large part of my daily life because it was grace that the hand of AA was there to reach out to this suffering alcoholic. I am forever grateful, and I demonstrate my gratitude by offering my hand to the next alcoholic who reaches out. *Very lucky don't you think?*

But I desperately didn't want to drink anymore and those strangers in the meeting tolerated me, even comforted me, and surprising (to me) invited me back!

Now I have some time under my belt, how easy it is for me to forget this tradition when another drunk stumbles into our meetings loud and obnoxious. I have become accustomed to our order, and to the natural flow of the meetings. Chaos is now uncomfortable, so my instinct is to want to stay away from this newcomer.

It takes just one person, wiser than myself, to gently remind me that this is how we usually come in - as a HOT MESS! And that it takes time, love and guidance to become part of our fellowship. In fact, this is a reminder of how far I have come - because this was me not that long ago, and could be me again in the future if I allow myself to become intolerant, judgmental, unforgiving.

All of the traditions have their own challenges, but this one - inviting, accepting and loving the alcoholic first coming through our doors is the basis of our fellowship. Without this tradition we would have no need for AA!!

Step 3

“Made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him.”

Many newcomers to AA think “How can I turn my life and my will over to God? I don’t believe in God, I don’t believe in any higher power.” For the newcomer, it is important to take note of the first words of the step “Made a decision.” It is only a decision, I am not required actually to turn my will over at this time. This makes it possible for those who do not have a God or higher power of their understanding to take this step. I need only be willing, have the willingness to turn my life and my will over.

When I got sober, I believed in God, I just didn’t think he believed in me. My life was at a very low ebb. I wanted to die every day when I would wake up so hungover I could not get out of bed. I’d struggle all day before I’d finally let myself drink at cocktail hour as I prepared dinner. I finally entered rehab and never looked back. I was ready to turn my life over had made a mess, of it. I was desperate. I wanted to kill myself. Anything would be better than that. And it has been for more than a few years. I still say the Third Step prayer every morning and night. I am grateful to turn my life and my will over to my higher power who has my best interest, always. I feel lighter, more confident, because I am not in charge. I will be taken care of, given the strength I need to face anything.

For me, this is a priceless gift.

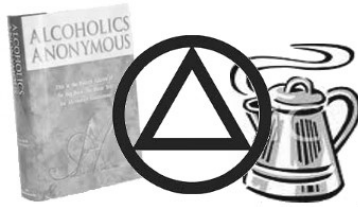

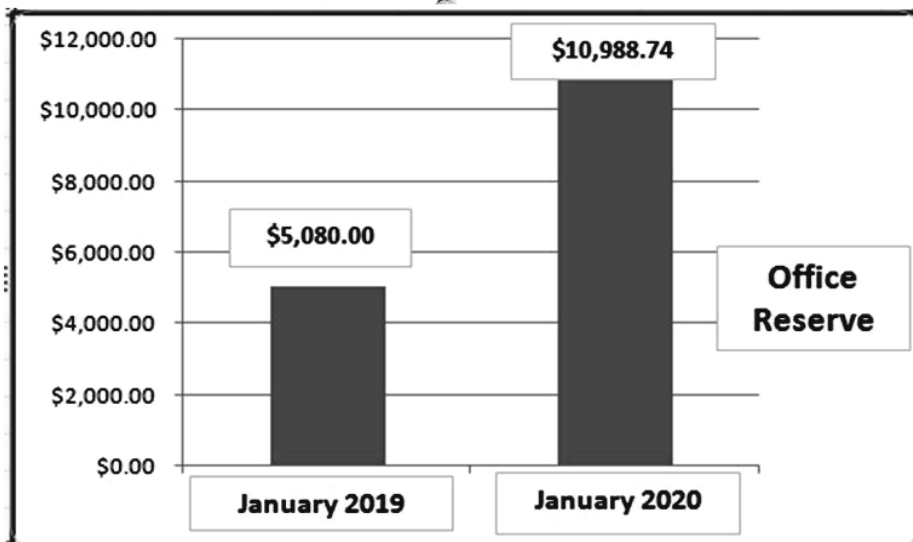
"Now that we are sober in A.A., the word 'support' has to do with sharing, people, self-respect, gratitude, and what we are privileged to give - not take - in material terms."

MINUTES – JW presented the December meeting minutes (page 7 of the POST). Report was approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT – PB presented the December Treasurer's Report (page 8 of the POST). It was noted that the Office Manager's salary included salary, payroll taxes, and a partial reimbursement of back pay approved at the December Intergroup meeting. Report was approved.

PHONE COMMITTEE – SS was not in attendance; she sent an update that all 24 hour phone slots are currently filled.

POST – DO was not in attendance; she added another email address for birthday submissions (by the 12th of each month) to POST@AAGainesville.org and debrajoberlin@gmail.com.

LITERATURE & MERCHANDISE/WHERE & WHEN – FS reported the Where and When was updated and reprinted in January. Rise in printing prices, including cost of printing the POST, was discussed.

WEBSITE – WM was not in attendance; he sent a report that the website is current.

ACTIVITIES – JH was not in attendance; a reminder was made to submit activities for posting on website.

DCM REPORT – There was no formal DMC report. Service Fair is to be held 2/2/2020 at Parkview Baptist Church with area delegate and officers to attend.

NEW BUSINESS – (1) Last year's Prudent Reserve goal was met based on average monthly expenses for 6 months. 6 months of expenses is a low level Prudent Reserve. (3) Other positions to be renewed or replaced this year are Chairperson and Treasurer to rotate out this summer and Office Manager position available December or sooner if qualified person interested.
