From the General Service Office regarding COVID-19

In these unprecedented times we must be mindful of not only our own health, but of the health of others in our group, families and communities. There are resources! This is what has been published on AA.org:

Our collected experience suggests that groups that are unable to meet at their usual meeting places have begun to meet digitally; doing so in a sensible and helpful manner to allow the group to continue keeping the focus on our common welfare and primary purpose. Some groups that are still meeting in person have shared about making changes to customs at their meetings. Some examples have included: avoiding shaking hands and handholding; making sure meeting hospitality tables are sanitary; or suspending food hospitality for the time being. Many groups have also made contingency plans in case the group is temporarily unable to meet in person. Regardless of group decisions, each individual is responsible for their own health decisions. Contingency plans have included: creating contact lists and keeping in touch by phone, email or social media; meeting by phone or online. If a group isn't holding its regular meetings, they may want to communicate this to local A.A. resources, such as the district, area and intergroup or central office. Many local A.A. entities have added information to their websites about how to change a meeting format from "in-person" to online. Some groups have shared that they are utilizing digital platforms such as Zoom, Google Hangouts, or a conference call. Some groups have also added a "virtual Seventh Tradition basket" to remain self-supporting and to keep up the services at the group and the A.A. entities that serve them. Per GOOGLE: The definition of **autonomous** is a person or entity that is self-controlling and not governed by outside forces.

We are not a corporation that wants everything in the company micro-managed. We are not unionized where we all must stand within hard-fast rules and regulations. Thank GOD. Personally I am so grateful that the founding fathers of AA realized that alcoholics, defiant by nature, could not "conform" to these ideals.

The last part of this tradition "except in matters affecting other groups of AA as a whole" keeps the renegade in us to a minimum. We are not to change our singleness of purpose, for example. Or change the steps, or start taking sponsorship for money from outside sources. Our founding members "hammered these traditions on the anvils of experience".

I go to many meetings for my recovery. While they all "feel" similar in ways they all are unique! I can go to women's meetings (or gender specific meetings), step 11 & 12 meetings, 12 and 12 meetings, Big Book meetings, speaker meetings, spanish speaking meetings, beginners meetings ... and the list goes on!! This keeps me excited about going to meetings. And while meetings are a part of recovery and not all of it, it is where I hear solutions in action! And WHY is that?? BECAUSE of Tradition 4, of course!

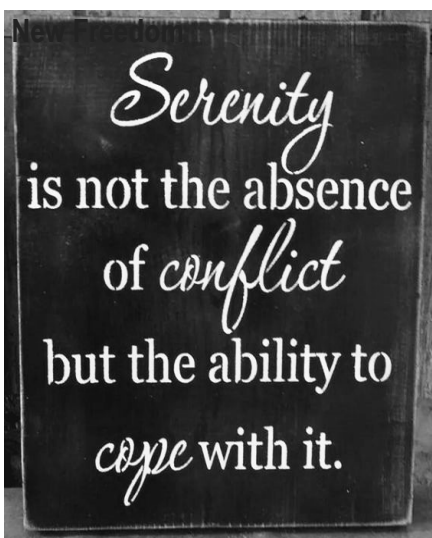

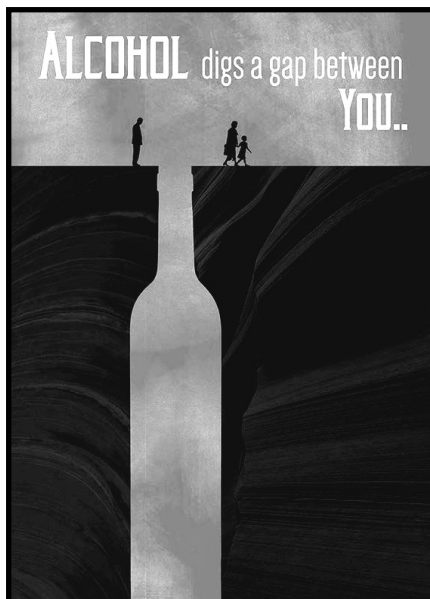
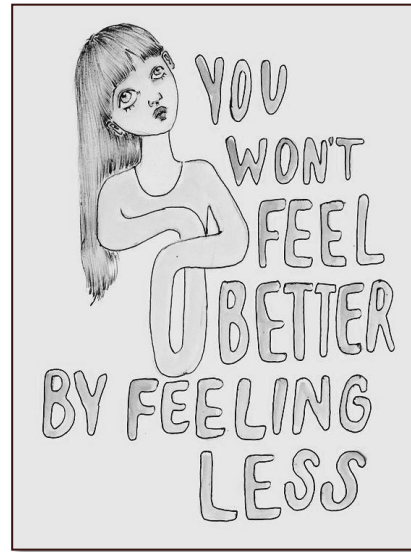
Self-support: Where money and spirituality mix!

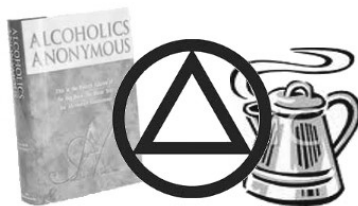

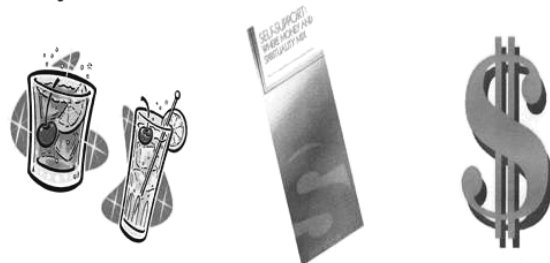

"Now that we are sober in A.A., the word 'support' has to do with sharing, people, self-respect, gratitude, and what we are privileged to give - not take - in material terms."



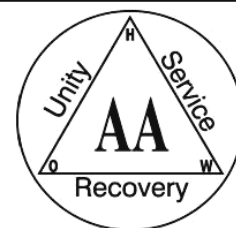

MINUTES – JW presented the January meeting minutes (page 7 of the POST). Corrections Needed: Attendance (add NF & correct WL) and newly appointed Director is Bill “B.” With corrections noted, Report was approved.

TREASURER’S REPORT – PB presented the January Treasurer’s Report (page 8 of the POST). Prudent Reserve funds purchased 2 CD’s to add additional interest funds to the Reserve. Arrears due to office manager have all been paid. While it was noted that last year’s Office Prudent Reserve goal was met, an average Prudent Reserve equaling 9 months of current office expenses would be \$15,000 so funds are continuing to be added to the Reserve. Report was approved.

PHONE COMMITTEE – SS was not in attendance; she sent an update that all 24 hour phone slots are currently filled.

POST – DO was not in attendance. It was announcement that she will be stepping down from preparing the POST and Intergroup is looking for her replacement. DO will assist her replacement in the transition, providing her knowledge and past experience in preparing the POST for print. Microsoft Publisher software is currently utilized, but WM can provide information on comparable free or lower cost software. Discussion was held complimenting the POST publication with its transparency including Minutes and Treasury Reports, attractive composition, and articles. Our 12 page POST is an outstanding newsletter, particularly when compared to other Intergroup areas that only publish online or publications as small as 2 pages.

LITERATURE & MERCHANDISE/WHERE & WHEN – FS reported the Where and When was updated and reprinted in January. Members are invited to visit Intergroup Office and particularly check out the large supply of Grapevine books on many topics for sale.

Regardless of group decisions, each individual is responsible for their own health decisions. Some groups have considered contingency plans in case the group is temporarily unable to meet in person. Plans have included: creating contact lists and keeping in touch by phone, email or social media; meeting by phone or online.”

GSO premised this statement by saying that they are not a medical authority and that interested individuals should consult federal, state and local healthcare officials for specific recommendations.

Next, District 14 has a new treatment chair, Michael O. Michael has several years experience and several years sober. He looks forward to seeing you at the monthly treatment committee meeting, where he can use all the suggestions and help that he can get.

Lastly, I am begging someone to step up and be the District 14 Secretary. There is no way I am going to be able to continue chairing District and being the secretary and everything else I am supposed to be doing. An ability to type an email, take notes at the monthly meeting (average of 30 to 45 minutes long) and a willingness to be of service and some sobriety are the prerequisites
