Power of Sober Thinking

In my experience, the answer to being ready to go to any lengths to stay sober has been unbearable pain. I have had to hurt so badly that the idea of getting uncomfortable enough to walk through the fear of facing my alcoholism and putting in the work it would take to stay sober is easier to swallow than continuing to live in my "comfort zone" and numb my pain with alcohol. As the alcohol stopped working for me over time and my fear became too much to bear, my "comfort zone" became anything but comfortable and I started to become willing to do something differently. When I came to Alcoholics Anonymous and heard you all talk about the effectiveness of the program and I started to believe it could work for me too, I decided to give it everything I had. I never had hope for my future before I got to Alcoholics Anonymous and I couldn't believe that there was actually a way out because I could never imagine it before.

When I see friends struggling to stay sober, I wish so badly that I could hand them the "Key of Willingness." It has been very difficult to watch people I care so deeply about continue to experience the horrible effects of active alcoholism. I have learned that we have to take every drink that we have to take before we become willing and that there is nothing anyone else can do to help us get to that point. It takes divine intervention and complete defeat.

I once heard a friend say "I wish you more pain," and I understand it completely. It is a loving sentiment that suggests we need to walk though terrible things before we are ready to change and seek solutions. Page 48 of the Big Book states that "it finally beat us into a state of reasonableness" and this is true for me. Today I am grateful that I reached that pivotal point and that my Higher Power led me to such a wonderful way of life.

An Important Message from GSO

GSO's General Manager, G.Gregory Tobin, in a letter to Conference members and dated May 12, 2020 regarding the financial impact of the pandemic:

With so much happening over these past few weeks ... the landscape across our organization seems to change every day.

Among these shifts have been the realities of our own financial situation. It's no secret that businesses and organizations from every sector have felt the economic impacts of this global health crisis, and we are no different ... to that end, on April 22nd the General Service Office made a request to the Trustees' Finance and Budgetar Committee and its chair, Leslie Backus, for an emergency drawdown of \$3 million from the Reserve Fund. This request was due to the decrease in book sales and contributions caused by the global pandemic.

Further, the unexpected financial situation brought on by the public health crisis has required several layoffs or temporary furloughs of workers in roles that no longer can be covered by salary continuation. While this has been a incredibly difficult decision our goal and responsibility is to maintain a sustainable, responsive organization to serve AA's needs and requirements.

Please remember that as many of us are suffering financially - where would we be if AA no longer existed? Give what you can, as if your life, and the lives of those still yet to come to these rooms, depend of the hand of AA to be there.

"An A.A. group ought never endorse, finance or lend the A.A. name to any outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property, and prestige divert us from our primary purpose."



There have been many a good natured servant that have attempted to tie our loving fellowship to all sorts of businesses and hospitals. Thank God these traditions were in place to keep us out of it completely. At first it sounds like a great idea; An AA hospital, recovery center, or even a restaurant! However, what happens if they falter? Would that possibly keep some from not seeking help in our fellowship? Can we take that chance? It is very closely related to the eleventh tradition in that aspect. What if our CEO got drunk? The backlash would be detrimental.

When you really "play out the tape," this tradition is a no brainier, and our future depends on it.

I was so excited when I got to step 6. *I was entirely ready to have God remove all my defects of character.*





Dear Conference members,

With so much happening over these past few weeks - including intense preparations for the 70th General Service Conference, committee meetings, board meetings, and other ongoing work in the office (in a virtual/telework environment) - the landscape across our organization seems to change every day.

Among these shifts have been the realities of our own financial situation. It's no secret that businesses and organizations from every sector have felt the economic impacts of this global health crisis, and we are no different. As a result, due to steep declines over the past two months in revenue from group contributions and literature sales, management and the boards have increased our focus on costs and expenses of office operations.

To that end, on April 22, the General Service Office made a request to the Trustees' Finance and Budgetary Committee and its chair, Leslie Backus, for an emergency drawdown of \$3 million from the Reserve Fund. This request was due to the decrease in book sales and contributions caused by the global pandemic. After a review of the cash flow analysis, the committee agreed to forward the request to the General Service Board. On Thursday, April 30, the General Service Board approved the \$3 million Reserve Fund drawdown. Over the past week the office has begun that process and will continue to access funds as they become liquid in our bank accounts.

The decision was made after reflecting upon the primary principle behind the prudent Reserve Fund that A.A. has maintained for decades: "To provide the financial resources necessary to continue the services of G.S.O. and the Grapevine in the event of emergency or disaster... " (The A.A. Service Manual, page S72). The coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, especially in New York City and the downstate region, is a true public health



emergency. State and City regulations have restricted the operations of non-essential businesses since March. Our office at 475 Riverside Drive has been shut down to the nonprofit tenants since Friday, March 27, when we moved to 95% telework status for our employees, and there are no immediate indications of when this will change.

Further, the unexpected financial situation brought on by the public health crisis has required several layoffs or temporary furloughs of workers in roles that can no longer be covered by salary continuation. While this has been an incredibly difficult decision, our goal and responsibility is to maintain a sustainable, responsive organization to serve A.A.'s needs and requirements.

In addition to the objectives noted above, we are now focused on providing support for our General Service Conference, which will take place Saturday, May 16 to Tuesday, May 19. We will be utilizing a virtual platform to conduct Conference business, and our team has been demonstrating an "all hands on deck" approach to ensure that the event is successful for the Fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous. While this is not something we envisioned even a few months ago, I am so proud of the resiliency and incredible work that has gone into planning. More discussion and reports on G.S.O. and AA Grapevine finances will be shared with you at the Conference.

This information and all that will be reported at the Conference are intended to be shared with the Fellowship, to keep the groups informed on Seventh Tradition funding of needed services, so that a true group conscience can be achieved in this difficult time for all.
