## A New Outlook on Life

When I was still out in the streets drinking, it was easy to think that the world was out to get me. The reckless way I was living put me in situations that caused trouble in my life. Suspensions from work, car accidents, jail, and failed relationships plagued my existence. Bills kept piling up. I couldn't for the life of me figure out why I was different from everyone else. Why would nothing go my way? Why did I have such bad luck? People told me that my drinking might be a problem, but what did they know? I was in complete denial. By the end of my drinking, I was a shell of a person. I wasn't suicidal, but I was just so tired of the world being against me. I just wanted it to all end.

I was lucky to be offered an opportunity to go to treatment. Through treatment I found AA. In AA I found a home. Never in my life had I met a group of people that understood me and could relate to my struggles and feelings. When I found the fellowship and began my journey through the steps things started to change for me, but most importantly, things started to change in me.

Things have not always been easy. In fact, I've experienced the hardest times of my life while in sobriety. Each time something happens I have been able to come out a little bit stronger and wiser. I try to look at events in my life as learning experiences, good and bad. I still tend to be stubborn and sometimes I have to learn the hard way, but I don't feel like the world is out to get me anymore. It's just life on life's terms. I don't feel so different today, because I am living differently. I'm doing my best to be a good person. I have ideals that I try to live up to

for myself. There are times that I fail and let people and myself down, but I no longer have to live in it. I can do my best to repair things and move forward.

My life has changed just by changing what I put into it. Being a useful, productive member of society, helping others, attempting to be the best person I can be, and most importantly expanding my relationship with God, has been game changing. When I came to Alcoholics Anonymous I was given a new outlook on life, and the ability to accept life on life's terms. Today I am living the life I didn't even know I wanted. —David A

This tradition means a lot to me. Anonymity is not only difficult to say, it is difficult to do. The principle behind Anonymity is humility, and for an Alcoholic like me, some days the task of being humble can be nearly impossible. When I first arrived in AA, I had no Idea what I was in for. People would tell me things like "Do something for someone without anyone knowing" or "Try to think of yourself less." It was not until many years later, that anything like this would actually occur in my life. To this day these little reminders keep me grounded. I wanted to tell everyone how great I was doing now that I was sober. I wanted people to know they could come to AA and become great just like me. But Bill and Bob were smart. They knew we would do these kinds of things, and that is why this tradition is in place.

A wise man once said "Trying to practice humility is like trying to practice spontaneity, it just doesn't work." So the writers couldn't just come out and say-- "Hey Y'ALL JUST BE HUMBLE WOULD YA???" So by Devine inspiration, this tradition was born. Genius.

"...Ever reminding us to place principles before personalities." My experience has usually been used as a more PC way to say "Love them, don't kill them", whenever I am angry and ranting to my sponsor. Usually it is because "They aren't doing it right!" More recently I have realized that in the appropriate context (and the one it was written for) it was to continue this idea that humility binds us together. It is reminding us to be anonymous and put aside our wants and desires- especially to get recognition, manipulate, or indulge in our ego. Looking back over the years and development of AA and the traditions, it is awe-inspiring to me how God's handiwork makes itself apparent in our program over and over again.—Jon C





# Step 12

But suddenly, I rejoiced that I was an alcoholic and that being so had brought me to AA. Deeply sorry for the harm done, I still know that if it had not been thus, even if I had never encountered alcohol, I would have lived and died like a vegetable, with never a glimpse of the incredible world of the spirit. Until I can say and do no more, my prayer is to be allowed to tell all this good news to alcoholics and to others, by word, by action, by example. And this last way is the most effective of all. In my drinking days, I was a seven-day, around-the-clock toper. Now I know that in the Twelve Steps and especially in the final phrase, "in all our affairs," I have something to fill each day of my life just as completely, around the clock. All I need do is listen a little, read a little, do a little, and think a little. In all history, was there ever such a bargain? -- B.C. Hull, Massachusetts, from August 1974 Grapevine
