My first few weeks working as a teacher in men's prisons were wild. I had visited a friend before doing a year and a half bid and I used to take meetings into a women's prison, so I thought I

So, one Sunday I just prayed for god to show me, one way or another, about this job- to reveal if it is meant to be, even if it's not the answer I wanted. I don't believe god always answers my prayers

knew how it would feel, but I did not. Half of the time I felt like it was exactly where god wanted me to be and I was doing what I needed to do with my life, and the other half I felt panicked and like I should just get out of there at all costs. This was thirteen years into sobriety and I was praying in the moments of panic that had me feeling like a newcomer, as if all

my spiritual footing that had just recently felt so solid was suddenly gone. I prayed in the moments of fear at work, and the little cliched slogans popped that it was exactly where god wanted me to be in up for me like life rafts. But at the end of each weekend, I would start to tense up as I prepared to go inside again on Monday morning. Balancing the very different worlds of the inside and outside was a struggle. I wanted this job so much because it felt like an extension of all of my beliefs and the gifts AA had given me- to go into darkness with faith that god will use me to bring light; to care for the wounded or hurt people, even if they've hurt others; to treat all people with respect and dignity, even if society doesn't, etc.

But I'd been sober long enough to know that what I really needed to want is what god wants, not what I want, because it's better and much less painful that way. Whenever I'm focusing on my plans for my life, anxiety creeps in because I shift into worshipping my reality instead of worshipping my higher power.



immediately or obviously (unless, of course, you're defining the point of prayer as building a relationship with god, in which case every prayer is perfectly and instantly answered, but I digress). This time, though, clarity arrived quickly. Monday I felt that soul clicking into place feeling without the accompanying fear and doubt, and it

has just continued that way. This isn't to say I'll stay there forever, but I felt in my heart a certainty that moment, and that was a beautiful gift. I have spent a long time, even in sobriety, attaching to certain plans for my life in terms of career or relationships or even personality, and the anxiety that accompanies that grasping for control is so exhausting. I'm very grateful for the true desire I have today to carry out god's will. There's so much more peace when I just ask for direction and trust that god will provide it. The relief I felt when I realized that I was where god wanted me to be, not just where I wanted to be, was deep. It took me years to be able to listen to that god voice instead of the fearful, rationalizing alcoholic voice, and I hope to not ever take

sanity and peace for granted. -RB

### **The Steps are HOW IT WORKS.** The Traditions are WHY IT WORKS.

"Alcoholics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the A.A. name ought never be drawn into public controversy."

To most of us, Alcoholics Anonymous has become as solid as the Rock of Gibraltar. We like to believe that it will soon be as well -known and just as enduring as that historic landmark. We enjoy this pleasant conviction because nothing has yet occurred to disturb it; we reason that we must hang together or die. Hence we take for granted our continued unity as a movement. But should we? Though God has bestowed upon us great favors, and though we are bound by stronger ties of love and necessity than most societies, it is prudent to suppose that automatically these great gifts and attributes shall be ours forever? If we are worthy, we shall probably continue to enjoy them. So the real question is, how shall we always be worth of our present blessings?

Seen from this point of view, our AA Traditions are those attitudes and practices by which we may deserve, as a movement, a long life and a useful one. To this end, none could be more vital than our Tenth Tradition, for it deals with the subject of controversy – serious controversy.

On the other side of the world, millions have died even recently in religious dissension. Other millions have died in political controversy. The end is not yet. Nearly everybody in the world has turned reformer. Each group, society, and nation is saying to the other, "You must do as we say, or else." Political controversy and reform by compulsion have reached an all-time high. And eternal, seemingly, are the flames of religious dissension.

Being like other men and women, how can we expect to remain forever immune from these perils? Probably we shall not. At length, we must meet them all. We cannot flee from them, nor ought we try. If these challenges do come, we shall, I am sure, go out to meet them gladly and unafraid. That will be the acid test of our worth.

Our best defense? This surely lies in the formation of a Tradition respecting serious controversy so powerful that neither the weakness of persons nor the strain and strife of our troubled times can harm Alcoholics Anonymous. We know that AA must continue to live, or else many of us and many of our fellow alcoholics throughout the world will surely resume the hopeless journey to oblivion. That must never be.

As though by some deep and compelling instinct, we have thus far avoided serious controversies. Save minor and healthy growing pains, we are at peace among ourselves. And because we have thus far adhered to our sole aim, the whole world regards us favorably.

May God grant us the wisdom and fortitude ever to sustain an unbreakable unity. Bill W. - September 1948



# **Step 10** *"Continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it."*

I find that the longer I stay sober and continue to work the steps, I truly have ceased fighting alcohol. Although, I am willing to admit that I have a hard time ceasing the fighting of anything or anyone. The 10th step reminds me to always strive to be a better human. I do this to protect myself (and frankly, everyone else) from day-to-day flare ups of selfishness, dishonesty, resentment, and fear.

I pray that I have the discipline to practice this step sooner rather than later. I know from experience that my attitudes will change for the worse when my spiritual condition isn't in check. It is easier said than done, trying not to react to situations that fuel my character defects, especially in any situation that involves a self-checkout line at the grocery store. You would think those things would be easy to use, but I begrudgingly disagree! Unfortunately, justified frustration is a well-known danger to me.

I try, and often fail, to be in a position of neutrality in all aspects of my life. I strive to keep in mind that I will have no moral code, no way to create a personal inventory, if I do not keep up with my spiritual condition. If I have conscious contact with my higher power, I know I can ask them for the courage to continue to set right from wrong. To remain objective, to maintain an emotional balance, I must first find the willingness to try. -KP



Chair Report – BC: Last night's first AA Trivia Night went well and was a lot of fun. Look for more in the future. Alt I/G Chair Report - MC: No remarks.

**Secretary Report – DK** asked for comments on the July minutes that were emailed. BF noted his name appears twice in the top section. Minutes of the July 25, 2021 meeting, as corrected, were accepted.

Motion by BF 2<sup>nd</sup> by GN. Passed unanimously.

**Treasurer Report – PB: July Sales** totaled \$501.55. Group and individual **contributions** totaled \$867.14. **Purchases** were \$221.45. **Overhead expenses** totaled \$1,407.95. **Ending checking account** balance was \$7,469.72. Available reserves include \$3,500 for Gratitude Dinner and \$2,500 for office expenses. **Office reserves** in CD's total \$4,824.57. The July 2021 Treasurer's Report (see September P.O.S.T., Page 7) was approved as reported.

Motion by Brian F. 2<sup>nd</sup> by GN. Passed unanimously.

**Phone Committee** – BC read **SS**'s report: There are no open shifts on the AA Hotline. He praised Sue S and the D14 Intergroup 24-hour phone lifeline as the best he has encountered in his 30+ years in AA.

**P.O.S.T. – TS:** Hard copies of the September newsletter were available for Reps to take back to their groups. Officers and Reps complemented TS on the September issue.

**Intergroup Office - FS** noted that the office is fully stocked. The next hard copies of Where & When will be available in the near future.

**Website – NL (Alt)** reported that the website is up to date. AO commented that she contacted the Webmaster and he has posted links to the CDC and Alachua County COVID-19 precautions. Alachua County's emergency order requires masks be worn by vaccinated and unvaccinated people in public, indoor meetings.

NM was elected by unanimous show of hands. BC thanked PB for agreeing to continue as a trainer and signer on the bank accounts.

BC closed the meeting at 1:50 PM with the Responsibility Declaration.
