I didn't understand that there was a sense of purpose, happiness, and community that was all too present in these rooms. I was wary of the group at first; when nudged to pick up my white chip I declined because I thought it was some sort of prank. I was unaware of the true sense of altruism that existed in these rooms.

Early on I was told that "Meeting Makers Make It." A few months after that, I heard the sarcastic reply "Yeah, they make it to meetings!" This program has a diverse way of getting us closer to our Higher Power. Simply going to meetings alone isn't enough for me, however meetings are still an excellent resource.

Meetings can both be a healing thing, as well as an opportunity for service. Attending a meeting gives me an hour where I can get out of my own head. When appropriate, a meeting is a place where I can bear my soul, get vulnerable, and be received with acceptance and understanding from my fellow recovering family. Meetings can also serve as a place to listen to others and better connect with them while fellowshiping afterwards. My personal relationships these days are intimate and meaningful, and I believe the skill to listen and connect to another is fostered by these meetings.

The announcement portion of a meeting allows me to understand what is going on in the community. There have been an innumerable amount of times where I


decided to get involved in service due to an announcement at the end of a meeting. These service commitments have helped me get through tough times, and even deepened my friendships.

## Tradition 11

The Steps are HOW IT WORKS.  
The Traditions are WHY IT WORKS.

*"Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, and films."*

... and let's not forget to virtually add "the Internet." Tradition 11 is vital in protecting our program for future alcoholics. It generally pertains to A.A. at the *group* level or lower on the Triangle.

Tradition 11 serves as "a constant reminder that personal ambition has no place in A.A. Each member becomes an active guardian of our Fellowship." (Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions [A.A.WS-1996]; Page 12). In today's world, celebrities sometimes need to be reminded that it's okay to identify as an alcoholic at the public level but not as an AA member.

AA's working in corrections and substance abuse fields may have AA friends from "outside" share at a meeting "inside." This is not the public level. It's a private, confidential, AA meeting setting.

I've shared for public panel discussions. I wouldn't mention I'm a member of "Alcoholics Anonymous." I *can* make the audience aware of AA and what it is (and is not). That's in keeping with our public information committee guidelines. If one person asks me after the presentation if I'm in AA, I can choose either response.

Finally, by all means don't hesitate to call the newcomer who stopped coming around. That is not promoting AA. That's Step 12.

It's a "we" Program. -DK

My initial God had no name. It was free-flowing, everywhere, powerful all the time. I didn’t communicate with it. I didn’t believe you did either.



After working the Steps the first time, and retiring from the “debating society,” a sliver of light penetrated my thick head. I came to believe conscious contact with a Higher Power, HP, was indeed possible, even necessary for recovery. I noticed the words “our” and “we” in the Step. Hope brightened the hole in my soul.


When I pray, I chat with my HP. I ask HP to help people, who are sick and suffering, especially hopeless alcoholics. To meditate, I go silent and get still; and then LISTEN. I get ideas for Twelfth Step or general service work to do; or how to be a better friend. I’m reminded my sobriety is a miracle.

Prayer and meditation work well early in my day, because it’s easier for me to listen if I’m not off to the brain-races. But the Step can be worked anywhere, anytime. It’s sacred to me and just for today, has kept me sane, sober, in my HP’s care; and away from the first drink. –DK

## Eleventh Step Prayer

Lord, make me a channel of thy peace--that where there is hatred, I may bring love--that where there is wrong, I may bring the spirit of forgiveness--that where there is discord, I may bring harmony--that where there is error, I may bring truth--that where there is doubt, I may bring faith--that where there is despair, I may bring hope--that where there are shadows, I may bring light--that where there is sadness, I may bring joy. Lord, grant that I may seek rather to comfort than to be comforted--to understand, than to be understood--to love, than to be loved. For it is by self-forgetting that one finds. It is by forgiving that one is forgiven. It is by dying that one awakens to eternal life.


