Tradition 12

The Steps are HOW IT WORKS.
The Traditions are WHY IT WORKS.

"Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities."

Why are we repeatedly asked in the Traditions to give up ourselves for the greater good? The answer is because any relationship we have that does not involve sacrifice is a relationship that likely will not endure. Each tradition straightens out a disastrous attitude we had about relationships. The twelfth tradition teaches us that a spirit of sacrifice (often times through anonymity) is vital to good relationships.

Giving up the expectation of rewards for doing good is difficult for most of us. It's easy for us to give and then think, "Well, I'll get a reward, even if I don't get public recognition for what I did." To remove that reward symbol from the back of our minds for whatever good we do is part of practicing anonymity. The next time you hear a speaker in A.A. whose personality is exciting from the platform, see if you can hear the principles behind their words? To which step, tradition, or concept can you relate their pitch? Setting ourselves aside and focusing on the principles of our program is a crucial component in the foundation we need for studying the Traditions and learning how to be in healthier relationships with our fellow A.A.'s and with those in the world around us.

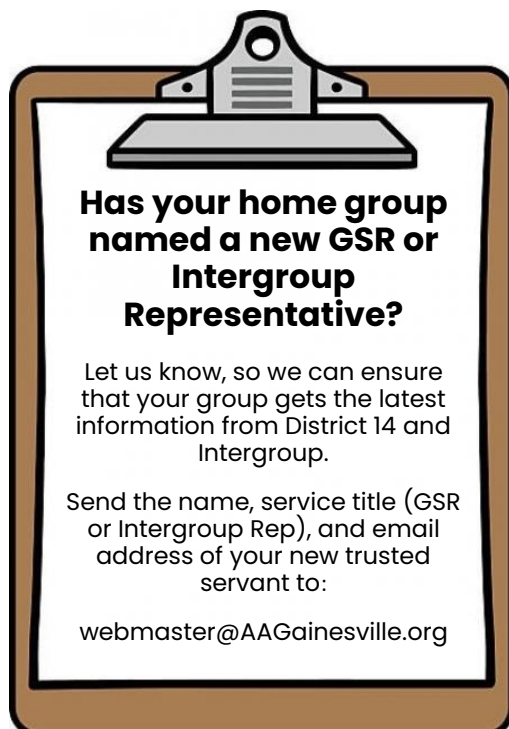
Step 12

“Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these Steps, we tried to carry this message to alcoholics, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.

Finally, a step that was EASY for me... at least by the time I reached it. The founding members knew what they were doing when they placed these steps in this order. The lessons from the previous steps were sometimes baffling, often painful... but then I come to Step 12, and “get to” practice THESE principles in all my affairs and CARRY this message to the still sick and suffering alcoholics. These principles – Honesty from Step 1. Hope from Step 2. Faith, Step 3. Courage & Integrity from Steps 4 and 5. Willingness & Humility, Steps 6 and 7. Brother Love & Justice from Steps 8 and 9. Perseverance from Step 10, Spirituality from Step 11, and finally Service with Step 12. This is a map to keep me in the middle of the road to happy destiny. This is a strong contrast to the life I was living in active alcoholism.... Where the world revolved around my needs, my wants, and MY FEARS! These steps brought be me from a self-centered mess to a life with purpose, with (mostly) good orderly direction and with GOD as my center. I have learned how to conform to the world and I found the key to happiness lies in what I can offer rather than what I can receive. I have received not one – but numerous spiritual awakenings during my time in this fellowship. I think it is fitting that this 12th Step is discussed during the 12th month – could during the spirit of Christmas. And through these 12 steps, I have found my Christmas spirit again. I wish I wrap these Steps up and give them to those I know who could benefit from them... but I know it doesn’t work that way. So, I’ll keep living by the principle of attraction vs. promotion. 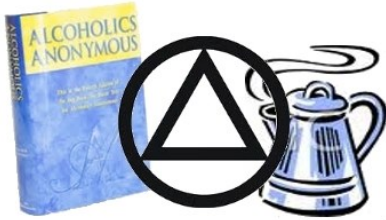

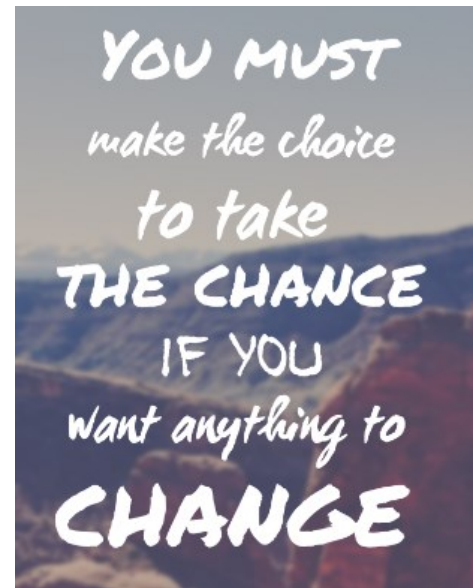
